The Courier Journal gives an instance af the efficacy of cream tartar as a prophylactic against the infecville, Ky. Several weeks ago a case of small-pox was developed in the house, and was sent to the eruptive hospital promptly, as soon as the nature of the disease was established beyon doubt, but not before all the members of the family had been exposed to the contagion for two or three days. By the advice of a friend, the family was induced to drink freely and often of cream tartar water, in the proportion of an ounce to a pint of water. Every member of the family has so far escped, while the coachman, who waited occasionally on the sick man, and who did not drink the the cream tartar water, contracted the disease, and is now a patient at the pest house. Dirty Discrimination.

On the 21st day of December. 1881 the Case Cattle Company bought of L. H. Carhart a herd of about 600 ject to like annoyances. head of cattle, on the Carrolton Stock range, paying therefor the sum of \$12,50 a head, and they were also to pay the same amount per head for the issue of the herd up to the 15th day of June, 1882. They agreed with L. H. Carhart that they would retain in their employ Geo. Bradford, agent of L. H. Carhart, to brand the calves. His tally was to be taken by both parties and the settlement made accordingly. This agreement was carried out to the letter, to the satisfaction of all parties.

There was also on the same range, a small "bunch" of cattle, branded ALN. About one year after the settlement on Bradford's tally of calves, the owner of the brand above named, Reverend W. A. Allan, brought suit against the Case Cattle Co., for seven calves, which he claimed as his. In the trial of the case, at the last session of the Circuit Court of Donley county, it was proven that the C. C. Co., had never branded any of Allan's calves. If there were any of Allan's high as the foretop. Captain Evans to Clarendon. Mr. Wright says, "1 calves branded for the C. C. Co., it must have been done by Bradford, the agent of L. H. Carbart, and for which the C. C. Co., was not responsible, and of which they had no knowledge. According to Allan's testimony, one of the seven calves had been counterbranded, leaving only six, as claimed by him. It could have have been proven, had it been allowed, that at least one of the C. C. one Co's., calves was branded ALN. How many more it is not known. It is presumable, and probably susceptible of proof, if there were any of Allan's calves branded for the C. C. Co., through mistake of Bradford, there were as many of the C. C. Co's., calves branded for Allan.

The Eaglets Caged,



Dressed Beef.

[Cincinnati Enquirer.] Chicago, July 10 .- There promises to be trouble ahead for the dealers in and shippers of what is known as dressed or Chicago beef, because of the increased rates of freight which Commissioner Fink, the trunk Ifne adjudicator, has decided it should pay. He has had the subject under consideration for some time, and it is stated upon good authority that he will recommend to the board of railroad agents at its next meeting that its rates per 100 pounds on dressed beef from this city to the seaboard shall be seventy seven cents instead of sixty-four cents, the present rate. Live stock pays but forty cents per 100 pounds, and this increase is at least ninety percent, over the live stock rate. The recommendations of the commissioner, it is believed, will be adopted by a majority of the freight pool when they come together, but all roads are not expected to agree

In New York the dealers in dressed MOBEETIE, beef complain that such rates will be ruinous to their business, and that they will be driven out of the mark et. If this should prove true it will leave the business again in the hands of the live stock men who can manip ulate prices to suit themselves, as they did a year ago.

Mr. Fink claims that from the statistics he has at hand it costs 193 cents per hundred pounds to ship the live stock, and 27½ cents for dressed beef. As the latter rate is not remunerative according to his imformation he will recommend the increase. The most of the beef is sent over the CLARENDON, Chicago and Grand Trunk road and Michigan Central. It reached New York by way of the New Jersey Central, North Pennsylvania and Reading




