Fishing by Electricity

According to a correspondens of the Philadelphia Press, the electrical apparatus of Professor Baird's expedition is very complete. He saw the snake after it strue him, and judged it to be of medium size. He cut the wound with bi knife and sucked it persistently for some time. He had sixteen mile to ride before reaching me, and was a little over three hoa s making th distance, stopping a short time at a ranch, where a mixture of salt susoda was applied to the wound

The parts were very much inflamed when he reached the takes, five mile south of town, where he dismounted and bathed the hand thoroughly.

When he reached Salt Fork, mile south of town, he was very thirsty, but too sick and dizzy to allow of his dismounting, being saihorse again.





der date of April 21, says the Texas cattle drive for this season is estimated at 240,000 head, against 350,000 head last year, or a falling off of 110, 000. The demands for cattle to stock western ranches, with the high prices they have brought in the last two or three years, has sent everything forward from Texas that would drive and the result is now seen in the falling off of the supply from this source, besides the extension of agricultural settlements in that state is each year appropriating territory heretofore appropriated exclusively to cattle raising and thus diminishing its area.
