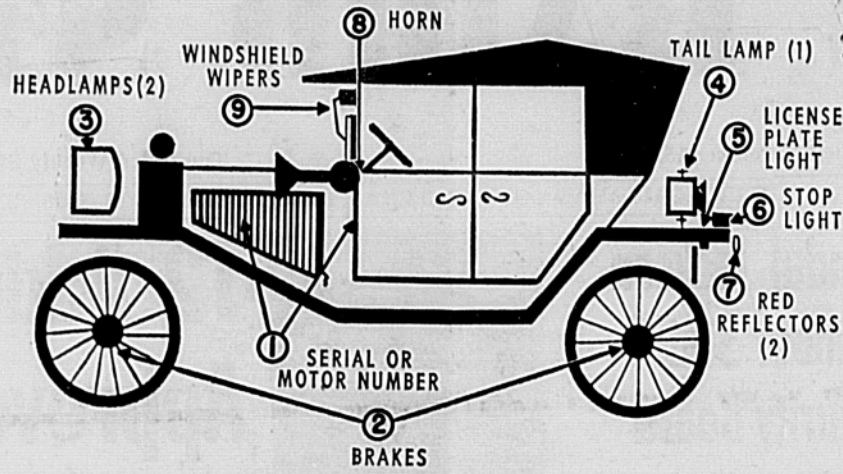

ABILENE — Officers and members of the Callahan County Historical Survey Committee have been invited to attend a Regional meeting on Saturday, March 19, 12:00 noon, at the White Elephant Restaurant in Eastland, according to Dr. Rupert N. Richardson, member of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee and Director of Region 3. The meeting is to begin with a luncheon.

Judge Scott Bailey, Eastland, is accepting reservations for the luncheon and meeting. Chairman of the Callahan County Committee is B. C. Chrisman of Baird.

Other officials of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee who will participate in this meeting include: A. M. Pate Jr. of Fort Worth; Truett Latimer, Executive Director, who will talk on the operations of State office; and Robert Risher, Research Assistant, who will talk on the County Committee Competitions for 1966.

Region 3 encompasses the

following counties: Brown, Callahan, Coke, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Erath, Fisher, Jones, Nolan, Palo Pinto, Runnels, Shackelford, Stephens and Taylor.

Richardson stated that nearly by county chairmen and members from other regions wishing to join his group at Eastland will be welcome.

TS&GRA Convention In Menard, March 26

The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association returns to the scene of one of its earliest conventions on Saturday, March 26th. The TS&GRA will have its spring quarterly membership meeting in Menard, site of a 3-day session that drew 800 conventioners in 1917.

Instead of a barbecue on the banks of the San Saba River, the Association this time will have a lamb luncheon in the Menard High School, serving three different lamb dishes, roast lamb, lamb pizza and lamb curry.

The spring meeting is all in one day to allow ranchmen to attend and return home without the necessity of an overnight stay. G. C. Magruder Jr. of Merton, President, said he hopes this will encourage a large attendance. The Menard location is handy to members in Central Texas and the Hill Country, as well as a large area of far West Texas. Registration will begin at 7:30 a. m. All committee meetings will begin at 9 a. m.

TS&GRA currently is cooperating in a statewide lamb promotion program sponsored by the American Sheep Producers Council. A big push is planned in April when lamb will receive large-scale retail promotion in stores all over the state. The Menard lamb luncheon is one of several conducted over Texas in March to promote lamb and its wide variety of uses.

J. L. Ault Completes Seven-Month Deployment

USS ISLE ROYALE — Seaman Apprentice Jimmy Lynn Ault, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Preston Ault of Baird, has returned to Long Beach, Calif., aboard the destroyer tender USS Isle Royale, after completing a seven month deployment in the Western Pacific, which covered 15-100 miles.

Isle Royale served as a mobile repair facility for Seventh Fleet ships in the Philippines, Taiwan and Japan. These ships ranged from radar picket destroyers to attack aircraft carriers.

Her crew includes 30 officers, 45 chief petty officers and 659 other enlisted men in 47 specific ratings, or occupational specialty fields.
