| TAXPAYERS' RIGHTS, REMEDIES, <br> RESPONSIBILITIES! <br> Charies SoRelle, chief appraiser for the Donley County Appraisal Distriet, has announced the avallability of an eight-page pamphlet which may help district residents save on their property taxes. <br> 'Taxpayers' Rights, <br> Remedies, Responsibllitles!" explains how the property tax system operates In Texas and highlights possible tax savings avallable to property owners. <br> The pamphlet is published by the State Property Tax Board under provislons of the Texas Property Tax Code. The information In "Remedies" applles to property taxes collected by all types of local government, Inclading counties, cttles, school districts and special distriets such as hospitals and maniclpal atility districts. <br> The pamphlet explains in detall the residence homestead exemptions offered by various taxing untts Includling the amounts of each exemption and what it takes to qualify for and recelve them. <br> For example, all homeowners In a school distriet are eligible for a $\mathbf{\$ 5 , 0 0 0}$ general residence homestead exemption. Also, certaln disabled taxpayers and those aged 65 or over may qualify for an additional $\$ 10,000$ <br> exemption from the value of | their homestends. <br> "A taxpayer who was 65 or older on January 1 of this year is also enttiled to a tax freeze, on his hoase and yard," SoRelle added. "This celling Is based on the taxes ansessed when a taxpayer recelves the over-65 school homestead exemption for the first time." <br> The chlef appraiser pointed out, though, that homeowners who recelved the elderly exemption and tax freeze from the school diatrict last year need not apply again this year. Only those who became 65 during 1983 and those whe have never been granted the exemption and freeze must apply for 1984. <br> Homeowners may also be eligible for a $\$ 3,000$ general homestend exemption for county tax purposes. This exemption ls granted on the portion of county tax for farm-to-market roads and flood control. <br> Additional exemptions are avallable upon application to disabled veterans and to other disabled cltizens or those aged 65 and older. <br> 0 wners of agricultural land which was taxed for 1983 on Its productivity value under 1-d-1 open-space provisions do not have to reapply unless requested in writing by the appralsal office to do so. However, applications must be filed before May 1 for land to be | taxed 10 r 1984 under 1-d-1 open-space provislons, and by landowners who have not previously recelved productivity valuation. <br> "More complete Information on special land valuation, tax renditions and exemptions is available from appralsal district personnel as well as in the pamphlet," SoRelle sald. <br> He sald that the "Remedies" pamphlet also contains Information about the appraisal review board [ARB] which serves to equalize all property values in the district. This section of the pamphlet serves to equalize all property values in the district. This section of the pamphlet outines the steps for making a protest to the ARB and ways to prepare and present the appeal. <br> Another section deals with the process of Initiative and referendum by which voters are able to pettition for an election to limit the amount of tax increase adopted by any taxing unit. <br> "District residents are encouraged to review the pamphlet and to make any applications required, in order to get all the tax rellef to which they are entitled.
