Tax Deferral Available For Homeowners

Texas aged 65 or older can postpone paying delinquent and current property taxes on their homes. They can take advantage of a tax option called "over-65 deferral" by signing an affidavit at the Donley
County Appraisal District office. Anpraisal District office Once a homeowner files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit with the quent taxes astc, no taxing unit can start or continue a lawsuit for delin quent taxes as long as that person owns and lives in that home. stpones paying delinquent taxes on the home; it does not cancel them. postpones paying delinquent taxes on the home; it does not cancel them.
During the deferral time, taxes and interest of eight percent continue to add up. When the elderly taxpayer no longer owns or lives in the home, the taxes become due. Taxing units can then sue to collect all the deferred tax and interest.

Filing of the deferral affidavit does not forgive penalties that are already due. Also, if the taxes remain delinquent more than 90 days after the deferral ends, an added penalty may be charged if the account goes to a delinquent tax attorney.
For more deferral affidavits are available at the appraisal district office. For more information, taxpayers may contact the Donley County Appraisal
