SEAT WARMERS POOR ASSET.
When a certain distributing company had a large filling station constructed in a central Texas town last spring, a rest room was provided for the ladies. In order not to
show partiality, seats were arranged for the men in front of the station. The seats were liberally patronized by a arge number, but it was soon found out that those who used the seats asked the most personal favors, and spent the least money. The manager figured that a good customer had little time to loaf, and that a loafer had to depend on his wife to make the money to spend at a filling station. Since the wife of a loafer can hardly afford a car and keep it going at the same time, there was little business to be gained by providing a comfortable seat for the healthy invalids who were able to do more than whittle. The seats were discontinued.
