Then another says: "We are certain of a special session, for the Governor has said the defeat of the pari-mutual horse-racing bill and the small chance of passing his sales tax bill will make it imperative that she call a special session.' <br> The dabbling in business by the State thru ill-advised legislation, and the creation of boards and bureaus and commissions, is the Our constitution seeks to protect all classes, but our Legislatures are busy passing laws giving special privileges to special groups, which completely set at naught the constitution. <br> We create commissions and boards to "regulate" groups in the interest of the people; then turn right around and permit those boards and commissions to fall into the hands of the groups we sought to regulate, and they then function for the groups, always against the people. <br> Take our Insurance and Banking Boards, our railroad commis-sion-all of them, and when you get underneath their functions, you get underneath their functions, you | find that they serve the groups they are supposed to regulate. I do not know a single board or commission down here that is not an impediment to right governmental functions, and is not in the hands anl under the control of those they are created to control end regulate <br> Take the greatest oil field in the world. The entire time of the rail Legislature has been devoted the protection of the oil men, total disregard of the consuming public. All the machinery of the government for two years has been directed to the task of giving profits to a bare 150,000 people, the expense of the $6,000,000$ in Texas. <br> No government was ever rightly administered thru boards.
