DEPRESSION AND THE DRAGON
Now that many have gone back to work in the larger cities, and even in some of the larger towns of Texas, loan sharks instantly beset the workers with a view of making a job. Now thas no demand for loans unt the borrower may begin "webbing up" in a mesh of high interest rates that will enslave them for all time.

The loan shark is the dragon that keeps them awake nights and haunts their moments by day. Texas has no interest rate applying to these small loans made under "a rangements" with a loan shark. It may be 20 percent a month which means 240 percent a year. That is said to be the customary fee charged at present. In some instances, paid, percent has been charged on ioans before they are re paid, according to information of the Houston Trades

Twenty thre
Twenty-three states permit a yearly interest rate of 42 percent on small loans. California took the lead recently in The Beneficial Loan Corporation operating in twentythree states pays its president $\$ 150,000$ a year. The vice president, who is a son of the president, gets half that sum. The corporation shows to have made handsome profits all through the depression.

Union labor is making the fight on loan sharks in Texas at this time. It means much to the laborers because their earnings do not go to buying necessities of life. Instead, these earnings go to feeding the dragon.

It is high time that some action should be taken by Texas' lawmakers that the handicapped citizenry may not become victims of a vicious system longer.
