## **Geology of This Area Supplies Local** Well Driller Interesting Study

Tapping his second artesian plain eroded down and during the water strata in Mulberry canyon, some four miles above the JA ranch bridge a few days ago, was the second time that well driller strata that flowed out on top. The flowing strata is found at a depth of around 140 feet.
