One team will be with the Sheriff's Dept. in mobil units watching the progress of the storm and in radio contact with the Fire Station at all times. Another team will be at the Fire Station and will be available for whatever emergency may arise. Also, a team will be available to help move patients to shelter at the Old Folks Home and at the hospital. <br> When, or if a tornado is sighted headed in this direction, the team with the mobil unit will radio the Fire Station and the storm signal will be sounded. Blasts Siren are defined as follows and everyone should clip this out and keep it handy so you will know what to expect. <br> ONE SIREN BLAST - Grass fire or out-of-town fire. <br> TWO SIREN BLASTS-Storm Warning-These two blasts will continue during the varning period with short intervals between each two blasts so it will not be confused with other signals. <br> THREE BLASTS-Business or Residential fire. <br> FOUR BLASTS - High Water Warning. <br> The local GOC post was on an aircraft alert this past Monday night.
