CCC Has Course in Living It Up on Fishing Vacation

CCC Has Course in Diesel Mechanics

Cooke County College will embark upon one of the school's most ambitious new programs in recent years this fall with the initiation of a complete two-year course of study in diesel mechanics.

CCC officials announced that completion of work on a new \$250,000 facility designed expressly to house the new program on campus is definitely scheduled in time for the beginning of fall semester classes on Aug. 29.

During this upcoming fall term, the new program will get underway with a basis principles course to be followed in subsequent semesters by a total of seven other six-semester-credit-hour diesel mechanics courses making up the core curriculum.

According to T. D. Bolinger, associate dean for occupational-technical education at CCC, the new diesel program is designed to culminate in a two-year associate of applied science degree requiring completion of a total of 63 semester credit hours. Diesel mechanics courses will account for 48 of these hours.

Paul Clayton a veteran of 30 years' experience on the job and in the classroom who will handle the bulk of instructional duties for the new program, echoes Dr. Laird's observations' regarding diesel mechanics as an area of tremendous vocational opportunity.
