## ERA ISD adopts new program for gifted students

The Era school board has approved a gifted and talented program to be implemented in the district in grades 1 through 5 by the beginning of the 1989-1990 school year.

Called the Soar Program, the top 10 percent of the students in each class will be identified for participation in the program, said Era Superintendent Dale Smiley.

The classroom curriculum will be modified for those students identified to provide gifted and talented activities during regular class time in each subject area, rather than separating the students from their classmates, Smiley said.

A committee of between three and five members, consisting of teachers and administrators, will screen students beginning this spring in grades kindergarten through 4 for entry into the program in the fall.

Students will be selected for the program based on test scores, achievement scores, classroom work, a parental inventory and other guidelines. The program will be expanded to include all grade levels by the 1990-1991 school year, Smiley said.
