Later he opened a store in Midland and prospered. Need for banking facilities prompted him to try finance and the private bank of Connell Brothers and Scharbauer was formed. In 1890 he organized the First National Bank of Midland. In July, 1898, he came to Fort Worth as cashier of the First National Bank. He became president of the bank in 1912 and was elected chairman of the board in 1931. Always keeping closely in touch with activity in West Texas, particularly in the cattle business, he had periodically added to his ranch and cattle holdings. Each year he visits his ranches and still enjoys a horseback ride or an overnight camp with the chuck wagon gang. All through the years he has befriended and aided scores of struggling cattlemen and small West Texas banks. He is the treasurer of the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association. "He and Mrs. Connell celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary in 1931."
