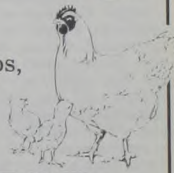

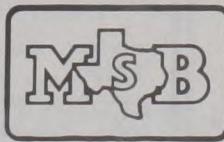

Photo by Frank Moster appears in *Texas Highways*

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Readers of "Texas Highways" magazine, January 1994, enjoyed and appreciated seeing a horizontal centerfold color picture made by Frank Moster, of a local landscape.

Formerly of Muenster, the son of Mary and the late Steve Moster, Frank is now a resident of Denton and a Science teacher in Middle School of Pilot Point for the past six years.

Another scene from a nearby location, also made by Frank Moster several years ago, appeared in a magazine in California and was sent to Mrs. Herbert Meurer by her sister, Lil Gallery, and given to Mary Moster.

Four of Frank Moster's photographs are also featured in "Texas On My Mind," a full-color book published by Falcon Press, now available at Muenster Public Library.

The photograph of the prairie, mesquite tree and setting moon on pages 28-29 of the January 1994 issue of *Texas Highways* magazine was taken several miles south of Muenster on Farm to Market Road 373. It was taken in January 1989 at

about 7:30 in the morning. The temperature was around freezing and wind was fortunately light.

I had taken a nice photo here without the moon several weeks earlier and, when the full moon came around, decided to try it again. There is only one morning, and only one evening per month, when this type of photo can be accomplished due to the synchronization of sunlight on the foreground and the moon being low enough above the horizon. Other factors must cooperate also; no clouds, very little wind, etc.

Equipment used was a 35mm camera, a 300mm lens, which is equivalent to a six-power pair of binoculars and makes the moon large enough in the sky, a sturdy tripod and Fujichrome 50-slide film. Before taking the horizontal photo used in *Texas Highways*, I took some vertical ones when the moon was higher. One of these vertical shots was used in the 1991 Audubon Engagement Calendar. I am often asked if this is a combination of two photos - it is not. If you had been there, you would have seen it exactly as it appears in the photo.

deductible is \$1,000 and many of the procedures that once required an inpatient stay are done on an outpatient basis," said Endres. "Therefore it is becoming less and less meaningful. I'd like to have approval for the hospital to pay the deductible for inpatient and outpatient services other than routine lab and radiological studies that are provided here at Muenster or at another hospital if they can't be provided here. This is mainly just to make sure that the benefit we are

offering to the employees stays meaningful."

David Bright moved that the change in deductible payments be made. Werner Becker seconded the motion and the other board members voted in favor of the change.

Glasscock also said that North Texas Community College is the name currently "leading the field" among possible choices, and he stressed the name is the product of long and intense deliberation based on carefully thought-out criteria which stipulated that a new name must:

- Accurately reflect the fact that CCC has grown from a small, narrowly-focused rural "junior" college into a truly comprehensive, full-service "community" college with a regionally focused mission and purpose;

- Help identify the college's geographical location and the region it serves in a way that would enable students at extension sites as well as at the main campus to relate to it as "their" community college;

- Contribute to the establishment of a positive image throughout the college's service area, and particularly along the I-35 corridor, that would make it more "marketable" from a competitive and recruiting viewpoint.

Endres reviewed a time line for the work of the advisory committee and said that official action on a name change is currently targeted for a special board meeting early the first week of March to accommodate such things as printing of class schedules and the college catalog and other activities.

"We welcome any public

comment on this matter," Endres said. "Citizens who have any input may contact members of the Board of Trustees individually, or they may address the board during the 'public forum' session provided for at the beginning of each regular board meeting."

In other business at CCC's Monday regular Board of Trustees meeting, 1994-95 employment contracts were renewed for full-time contract personnel, and trustees also approved a change in title for one administrator. Dean of Financial Services Heidi Ellis formerly held the title of Business Manager.

Nu-Tech Information Systems of Dallas, the low bidder, was awarded a contract to furnish replacement parts and upgrade a group of computers at the CCC-Denton Center. With new processor chips, new mother boards and increased RAM capacity, the units will be able to run all the most popular software packages under the Windows environment. Cost of the upgrading for 11 computers will be \$9,470.

On second reading, trustees formally adopted a revision to employee leave policy to bring the college into compliance with the new Family and Medical Leave Act. In personnel-related action, trustees accepted the resignation of Janice Call, instructor in the college's associate degree nursing program.

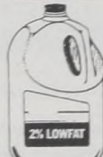
