## MHS Bees Lick Valley View 44-0

At their first encounter of this season the B stringers of Muenster High gave promise of developing into a capable first string. They plucked the young Eagles of Valley View by a score of 44-0.

The game was about as one sided as the count. Bees led their hosts 22-3 in first downs and 434-7 in net yardage. Also

they recovered four of Valley View's fumbles but did not lose possession at any time on a fumble or interception.

Their first drive was interrupted at the 4 as a series failed to make the needed yardage. However the hosts kicked four plays later and the Bees scored on a 21 yard pass from Glenn Felderhoff to John Schneider.

Passing was the Bees' main strength through all of the first half. Felderhoff connected on 9 out of 15 for 165 yards and three of those were for touchdowns. Schneider caught two of them and Gerry Cash one. Another favorite receiver was Ricky Swirczynski. Hank Trachta plowed over for the only bonus points of the half and the score at intermission was 20-0.

During the first half Muenster running was less effective. Total gains, made mostly by Ricky Huchton and Hank Trachta, were 55 yards.

Next half found the rushing game going better for Muenster and the passes not so good. Eagle blitzing accounts at least partly for Felderhoff's performance drop in the second half to 7 of 15 for 69 yards. Hard working Eagle defense spilled him several times and hurt his accuracy other times.

Meanwhile the Bees made a sudden improvement in their rushing game. After kickoff they went 63 in six plays for a TD. Big gains were 36 by Hank Trachta and Felderhoff's keeper play for 15 on the touchdown. Trachta added two points.

Next drive was for 32 yards after Felderhoff recovered Valley View's fumble on kickoff. It needed nine plays and Huchton made the last yard. Trachta added 2 points.

From then, about midway in the third quarter, Muenster moved several times but failed to keep going. It lost possession on downs four times and kicked once. That kick was blocked and gave the young Eagles their only good position of the night. It was on the 35 and a pass was good to the 19, but a fumble then wiped out the only Eagle threat.

Final TD for the Bees followed a pass interference on the 3 yard line with 1 second showing on the clock. Trachta made the score and also added two bonus points.

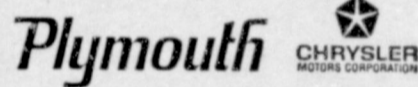

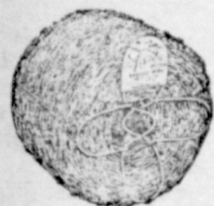

### Curtis Erpelding Back from Europe Reviews Travels

Curtis Erpelding, oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Erpelding of Colorado Springs, Colo., who is a college sophomore this year, traveled and studied in Europe for six weeks this summer with the World Academy For Foreign Studies.

During a week in Rome he enjoyed extensive sight-seeing including the Vatican, Catacombs, Colosseum, Appian Way and Via Vento. The latter is comparable to New York's Fifth Avenue or 42nd St.

From Rome his tour took him to Naples and Pompeii and from Brindisi by boat to Athens for a week in Greece studying and visiting the Acropolis, Parthenon and other glorious remains of ancient time.

He watched the moon landing on TV in Athens. Storekeepers set up television sets facing the street and people gathered to watch. He found Greece dusty, dirty and with little show of economic promise with the exception of the coast line and Greek Islands which are beautiful.

Yugoslavia reminded him of the US mid-west with large fields of corn and grain. In Belgrade he found the people much more friendly than in Greece.

Switzerland is as picturesque as the travel folders depict it. France — held back in economic progress because of the De Gaul regime — has poorer highways than other parts of Europe. The country homes are all a dull sandstone color; the people prefer to do their improving inside where it is not noticeable to the tax collectors.

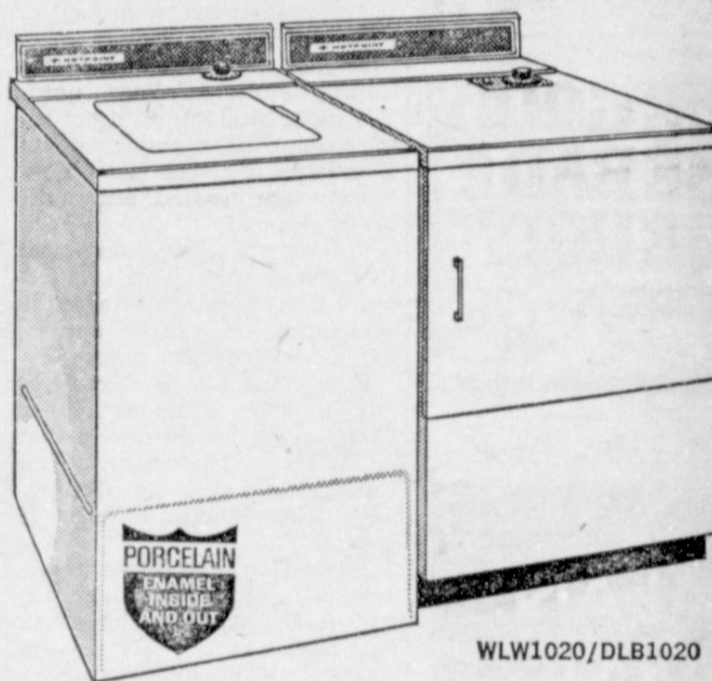

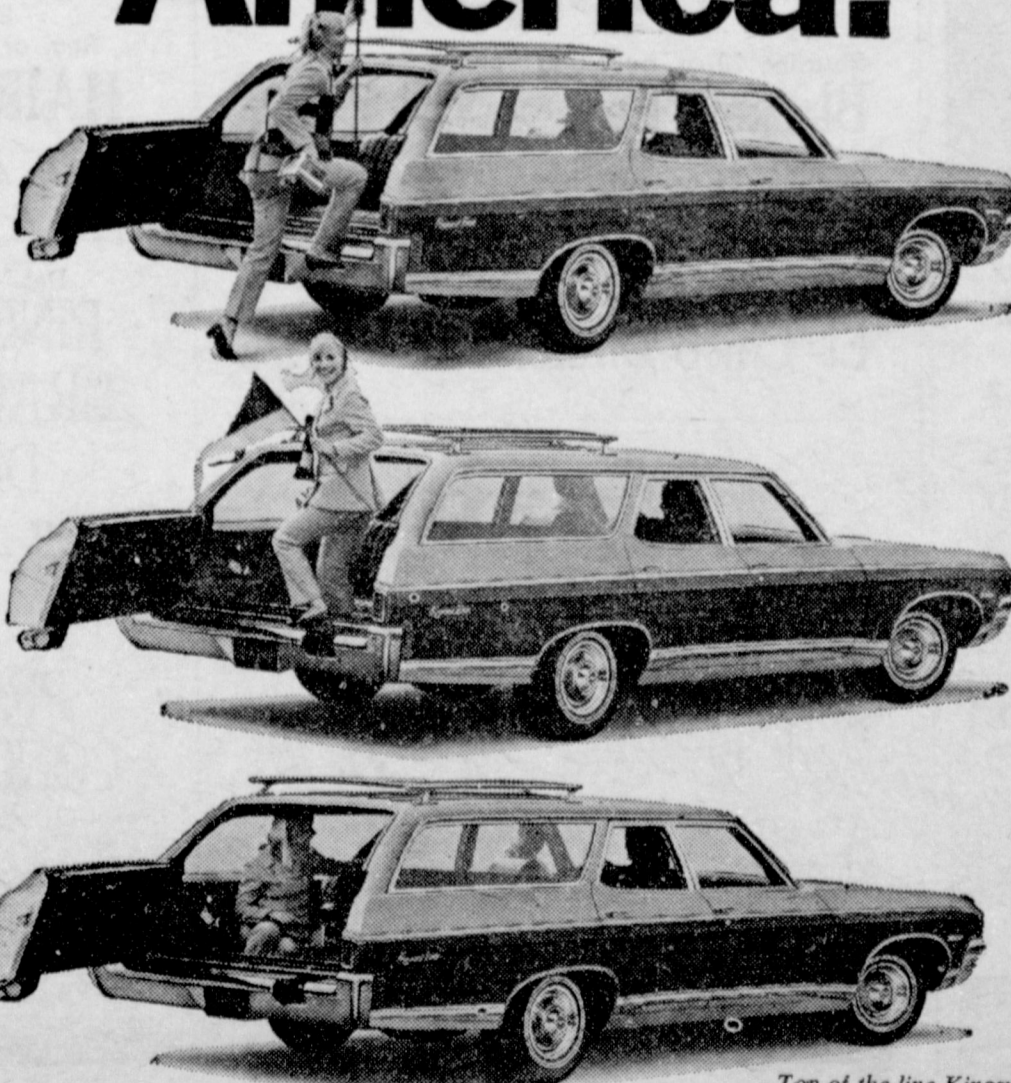

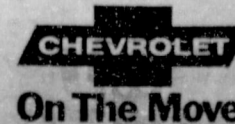
