## LISD directs attorney to pursue delinquent taxes

Harold Lerew, the attorney hired to collect
Lindsay Lindsay ISD's delinquent
taxes, attended the Sept. 16 taxes, attended the Sept. 16
meeting of the Board of
Trustees Trustees. He was invited by
Superintendent Superintendent Travis
Winn to attend and answer Winn to attend and answer
any questions Board
members might have. Lerew also wanted input from the Board on a delinquent tax
situation in the District. Lerew told the Board thation a business in the District owes two years of back
taxes of about $\$ 15,000$ to
Lindsay ISD and about $\$ 32,000$ when what is owed to the other taxing entities is added up. He said that a
tax warrant tax warrant has been
issued. It is hoped to get the business on a tax payment agreement that includes a substantial down payment.
Financial information was Financial information was
requested from the business, but not yet were told that the business
had applied for a SBA loan. An offer was made to pay $\$ 5,000$ down and $\$ 750$ a month for a year at which
time it would be bumped up to $\$ 1,000$ a month. Lerew say the entire tax bill whed to pay the entire tax bill w
the SBA loan is funded Lerew said that he did Learch to find out who the
business's other lenders business's other lenders
were. I'm just nervous
about thic and I thought come and ask you for some
feedback to see if you knew anything about the operations out there," Lerew
remarked. "We're always
reluctant to shut down a business because it puts
people out of jobs. We feel
like like if we have to seize
property out there we may

Normally Lerew said this is the type of situation that they work with the tax
