## Shakes Area

4.7 on the Richter scale rumbled .7 on the Richter scale rumbled
hrough the High Plains area and parts of New Mexico at 5:46 a.m Thursday, December
Inez Flores, Muleshoe residen reports feeling her bed shake.
Several other individuals heard booming noise in connection with he quake.
After being shaken awake, High Plains citizens affected by the small quake began to peg geologists who located the quake's epicenter at 35
miles southeast of Hobbs, N.M. and 50 miles north of Odessa. This was according to the U. S
Geological Survey Nation Earthquake Information Center. There were no damage reports, but
pictures were reported to have been thrown off the wall near Hobbs. KAMC-TV did report cracks in a
ceiling or two near Odessa. The ceiling or two near Odessa. The
"light earthquake" was felt from the Lubbock area northward to the Panhandle and west to Roswell. The Lubbock Avalanche-Journal
reported that the cause of the earthquake is unknown, but that is possible that some West Tex
earthquakes stem from oil recovery The AJ also noted that Melinda Simpson, who lives in Kermit said her mobile home was shaken.
"It felt like someone was outside just rocking the trailer back and just rocking the trailer back and
forth," she said. "Everything was rattling. It woke me up, and lasted probably about 30 seconds.
The only reported damage, according to the AJ, was in Eunice,
N.M., where police received a call N.M., where police received a call
about cracks in walls and another about broken glass.
John Weadock, news director for
KENW-TV in Portales, New Mexico reports that although Portales was not seriously affected by an earthquake that occured at
$5: 45$ a.m. Thursday, January 2 , it was measured at 4.7 on the Richter scale. Police in Roswell, Hobbs, Lovington and Carlsbad report that "hundreds of people called to report feeling the quake, but that no
damage was reported in those areas."
State po State police dispatcher in Roswell
said the said the ground "shook there for 15 seconds. The epicenter of the quake was reported to be 35 miles
southeast of Hobbs and 50 miles north of Odessa.
Both AP and ABC's "Good Morning America" made reports on the quake.
