## Home Hospice of Cooke County to host annual teleconference

Each year the Hospice Foundation of America (HFA) presents a nationally recognized distance-learning program, live via satellite, to more than 125,000 people in 2,000 communities. For more than a decade, this annual educational program has been instrumental in educating health care professionals and families on issues affecting end-of-life care. It also provides an opportunity for a wide variety of professionals - including doctors, nurses, ethicists, educators, social workers, and bereavement counselors - to share and exchange ideas and obtain continuing education credits.

This year HFA's 12th Annual National Bereavement Teleconference focuses on "Ethical Dilemmas at the End of Life". The subject of ethics at the end of life

generates an array of opinions and responses on methods to improve or enhance the quality of life for the terminally ill. Moderated by Cokie Roberts, ABC News Political Commentator and NPR Senior News Analyst, the program will be broadcast Wednesday, April 20, from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Home Hospice of Cooke County will serve as a local host for the teleconference, which will be held at the North Central Texas College Library Lyceum.

Ms. Roberts will lead a panel of noted authorities. This live-via-satellite, televised broadcast will offer constructive advice to those who are facing the difficult circumstances that

surround caring for someone who is dying.

Cases like that of Terri Shiavo bring national attention to ethical decision-making and dilemmas in end-of-life care. But there are ethical dilemmas that must have answers each and every day.

A local panel of experts will be present to answer questions during a 1/2 hour discussion following the teleconference. This panel discussion will provide the attendees the opportunity to ask questions pertaining to local issues and this will also provide three CEUs for most disciplines. The cost of the teleconference is free and the CEUs will be available for a \$25 fee.

## Blood donors needed April 21 at Muenster ISD gym

Texoma Regional Blood Center will hold a blood drive on Thursday, April 21 from noon until 8 p.m. in the Muenster ISD new gymnasium.

Requirements for donors include these:

At least 17 years of age.

No maximum age limit;

Weight a minimum of 110 pounds;

Must not have had Hepatitis (any type of hepatitis or jaundice, other than at childbirth, is a rejection), active infection; active allergies or tuberculosis, malaria asthma; recent shots, (prospective donors who have had malaria, lived in an area, or have had malaria surgery; unexplained malaria treatments are deferred for three years), etc.

rheumatic fever, heart disease, liver disease, shortness of breath, persistent cough or chest pain, bleeding abnormalities, or blood disease.

Diabetic donors are acceptable if the diabetes is controlled by diet or oral medication. Donors requiring insulin are deferred.

Other deferrals may come from: recent cold, sinus, or respiratory infection; active allergies or recent vaccinations, or inoculations; recent major surgery; unexplained weight loss; stomach ulcers, etc.

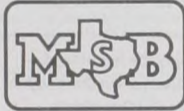

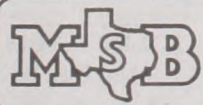
The menu includes Italian sausage, salad, spaghetti, homemade Italian bread, tea, and cobbler. Sausage and baked goods will also be available for sale.

## Lifestyle choices contribute to healthier aging

**Fact:** Waves of baby boomers are turning 65, making a dramatic impact on the shape of America's health.

**Fiction:** As people reach age 65, their physical and mental health quickly and inevitably deteriorate.

"People are living longer," said Dr. Eduardo Sanchez, Commissioner of the Department of State Health Services (DSHS). "We have increased life expectancy from 47 years in 1900 to 77 years today. And 25 of those 30 years of increased life expectancy came from advances in public health - immunizations, safer and healthier food, clean water, and improved sanitation."

Now, Sanchez notes, "We need to look at the quality of these years as well as the quantity."

The leading causes of death for people 65 and older are heart disease, cancer, and stroke. "But the three actual causes of death are chronic problems - tobacco use, poor diet and lack of exercise, and alcohol abuse," Sanchez said. "And chronic illnesses have a major impact on quality of life." About 80% of people age 65 and older have at least one chronic condition, and 50% have at least two.

The magnitude of these issues also can be seen in the sheer numbers of older adults. In Texas in 1900, people age 65 and older made up 2.4% of the population; 100 years later, the percentage was 9.9%. Forecasts for 2030 point to a potential population of 7 million people age 65 and older, just over 15% of the state's projected population. "Everyone, including older adults, can improve their lives by making healthy lifestyle choices, getting regular screenings, and taking advantage of prevention measures," Sanchez said.

"First, practice healthy living to help prevent health problems," Sanchez said.

The 2004 Texas Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) survey shows that

nearly a third of the state's adults 65 and older rated their general health from fair to poor. Nearly 30% reported their physical health not good for five or more days a month. And more than 30% of this population said they had no leisure time physical activity in the past 30 days.

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), healthy lifestyles are more influential than genetic factors in helping older people avoid the deterioration usually associated with aging. Among the recommendations are:

- Eat a healthy diet;
- Do not use - or quit using - tobacco;
- Limit alcohol intake;
- Be moderately physically active for half an hour five days or more a week;
- Maintain a healthy weight.

"Second, get screenings to detect illnesses early," Sanchez said.

Last year, about 92% of women age 65 and older reported having ever had a mammogram to screen for breast cancer, and 87% of older men reported having ever had a prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test and/or a digital rectal exam to detect prostate cancer, according to BRFSS data.

But only about 58% of those 65 years and older have ever had a sigmoidoscopy or colonoscopy to screen for colorectal cancer, which is the second leading cancer killer in the United States following lung cancer. Other routine screenings recommended for older adults include those for diabetes, high blood pressure, glaucoma, and other vision problems, and osteoporosis.

"Immunizations against influenza and pneumococcal disease are a third way for older adults to reduce their risk for serious illness and death," Sanchez said. Older adults should get a flu shot yearly. Those who have never had the pneumonia vaccination should get one. In Texas in 2004, about a third of those 65 and older had not had a flu shot within the past year or had a pneumonia shot ever. Also, all adults need a tetanus booster shot every 10 years.

"There are growing numbers of people both old and young with diabetes, heart disease, high blood pressure, and depression," Sanchez said. "We can do something about these chronic conditions. And for many older Texans, it is not too late to take the steps necessary to be healthy."

# Are you chemically dependent? MHMRS offers test help

Many people are suffering from drug and/or alcohol problems in our area and do not know where to turn for help. Mental Health Mental Retardation Services of Texoma has recently entered into a contract to provide an Intensive Outpatient Program for the treatment of Substance Abuse and Dependence Disorders in Grayson and Cooke Counties. Treatment focuses on Early Recovery Skills, Family Education, and Relapse Prevention. The goal is to address important issues in the areas of initial stabilization, abstinence, maintenance, and relapse prevention during the early recovery process. A person does not have to have a mental illness to qualify for

services, but must have a substance abuse disorder or co-occurring mental illness. The contract serves the indigent, women, pregnant women, and individuals with children in foster care. Services are also offered to persons with insurance. A sliding scale fee is used for payment. Here is a simple test to evaluate a person's need for counseling. If you answer YES to one of the questions, there is a definite warning that you MAY BE chemically dependent. If any two or more answers are YES, THE CHANCES ARE that you are chemically dependent. If you answer YES to any three or more, YOU ARE chemically dependent and in need of help.

Have you ever been high, drunk, or hung over while doing something important like work, school, or caring for children?  
 Have you ever missed work, school, or failed to meet responsibilities because of being high, drunk, or hung over?  
 Have you ever been drunk or high in situations where it might be dangerous (driving a car, operating equipment, etc.)?  
 Has drinking or drugs ever caused you legal problems?  
 Has drinking or drugs caused problems with other people such as friends, employers, spouse, parents, siblings, coworkers, etc.?  
 Do you continue to drink or use despite problems with others?

Did you ever start drinking or drugging and end up taking more than you intended, did you ever spend more time or money than you had initially planned once you started?  
 Have you spent a lot of time either using drugs or alcohol, getting over using, or looking for more?  
 Did you ever drink or use alone, or find yourself using or drinking rather than spend time on hobbies or with family?  
 Did your drinking or drug use ever cause you to be depressed, ashamed, anxious, or have difficulty in sleeping?  
 Did it cause you physical problems or make a physical problem you had worse?  
 Did you continue to drink or use drugs in spite of psychological or physical distress it caused you?

Do you find that over time you needed to drink or use more of a substance to get the same effect you used to get from drinking or using a smaller amount?  
 Did you find that drinking or using the amount had less effect on you over a period of time?  
 Are drugs/alcohol making your home life unhappy?  
 Do you use drugs/alcohol because you are shy with other people?  
 Are drugs/drink affecting your reputation?  
 Do you crave drugs/alcohol at a definite time daily?  
 Do you use drugs/alcohol to escape from worries or troubles?  
 Has a physician ever treated you for drug/alcohol problems?  
 Do you use drugs/alcohol to build to your self-confidence?  
 Have you ever been to a hospital or institution on account of using drugs/alcohol?  
 Is the use of drugs/alcohol jeopardizing your job or business?  
 Has your ambition decreased since using drugs/alcohol?  
 Have you ever stolen, pawned property, or "borrowed" to get money for drugs/alcohol?  
 Do you ever turn to lower companions and an inferior environment when using drugs/alcohol?  
 Does using drugs/alcohol make you careless of your family's welfare?

Have you gotten into financial difficulties as a result of using drugs/alcohol?  
 Did you ever experience any of the following after doing without or when coming off alcohol or another drug? Withdrawal, Shakes, Cold and Hot Sweats, Cramps, Irritability, or Intensive Need to Use Again.  
 Have you done something and did not remember the event while under the influence of alcohol?

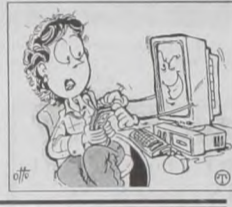

## Avoiding money order fraud

Internet chat room or online auction site. The con man claims to have financial problems and to need help cashing money orders. The

person "in need" often claims to be living in a foreign country.

A new counterfeiting scheme has allowed scam artists to cash in thousands of phony money orders — and Americans are footing the bill. Fortunately, there are ways to protect yourself. According to U.S. Postal Inspectors, the scam begins



when a victim is contacted by someone through an

Victims are lured into the scam when they are told they can keep some cash from the money order as payment for cashing it and wiring the difference to the con man. The scammer then mails the victim a counterfeit money order with instructions for the victim to deposit it in his bank account and wire the money back to the fraudster. Victims usually learn the money order is counterfeit only when they attempt to cash it or when their bank account takes the hit for the full amount of the money order after the bank refuses payment on the bogus deposit.

The good news is that legitimate money orders have security features that help distinguish them from counterfeit notes. For a full list, visit the Web site [www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm](http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm).

Knowing the signs of an authentic money order helps, but according to Postal Inspectors, so does using your head. They warn that most lures promising quick and easy money are cast by fraudsters — and if an offer sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

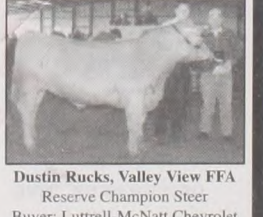
