### New treatment for congestive heart failure approved

Congestive heart failure is the commonest cause of hospitalization in patients over age 65 according to Medicare data. It is an ominous diagnosis with almost half the patients dying within five years after the diagnosis is first made. Treatment so far included a combination of 5-6 medicines in adequate doses plus treating underlying causes like hardening of coronary arteries and high blood pressure. FDA and Medicare have recently

approved a new method of treatment of this deadly disease. This involves insertion of a special pacemaker which can stimulate both ventricles (main pumping chambers) of the heart almost simultaneously. This pacemaker car now be implanted in Gainesville. This is done under local anesthesia. 

Bielagus, a 20-something who himself was \$5,000 in credit card debt his freshman year of college, began touring the country three years ago trying to prevent college students from making the same mistakes with the finances as he did.

"When I arrived on campus, I signed up for every credit card they threw in front of me. No one ever told me this hurts my credit score. No one ever told me I even had a credit score."

As one of the few professional speakers committed exclusively to this niche, Peter travels to colleges and universities nationwide introducing college students to their financial lives. "Most Americans, let alone most college students, don't know what their credit score is," says Bielagus. "This number literally determines how expensive your life will be and will affect your ability to get a job. 


