### Graduation

Kara Felderhoff welcomed guests to the graduation, noting that this was a day that they had been anticipating for a long time. Lauren Sepanski then introduced Joshua Yosten, Class Salutatorian.

Joshua opened his salutary address with a quote from the Bible, Ephesians 6:12-17. It

referred to putting on the armor of God to be able to resist the evil. He said that their parents and also their teachers at Sacred Heart had helped equip them with this armor of God. "Through many challenges and struggles, they have helped us learn more about God and gain a more profound understanding of how Christ wants us to live our lives," Joshua stated.

The class has always been known among the teachers and the graduates' parents for their competitive nature, Joshua noted. "This nature gives us the drive to finish what we start and kept all of us on our toes throughout the years," he continued. "I believe that this competitive nature will help us to stay driven to be the best that we can be in all aspects of our lives."

The salutatorian concluded his speech with a phrase that he said he hears each day in his family prayer, "We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us."

Colby Richey introduced the Valedictorian Stephen Davis.

Stephen remarked that as they looked back at their accomplishments, they were also wondering what the future will hold for them. "We have all been given the right tools to go into the world and succeed," he said. "A hard work ethic, dedication, trust, and integrity are a few of the many values that have been entrusted to us as students at Sacred Heart High School. We now have a decision to make, a pathway to choose."

As students, Stephen said that they were taught that the core value of their lives is love of God and love of neighbor.

"We were taught that true love is sacrificial love, and Jesus' death was the greatest example of this," Davis said. "We were also taught to think of others first and always be ready to serve our neighbor. We learned to forgive others and always trust in God's mercy for our mistakes." He said that when our lives on earth come to an end, we will not be rewarded by the

amount of money we have made, but on how we have loved God and cared for others.

Stephen said that they had two men in their lives who were examples of how to live that way. The men were Fr. Pat Murphy and Joe Caserta. "Fr. Pat continually showed us how to live out these values in our lives," Stephen noted. "He never tired of giving of himself, and worked constantly in his service to others." Of Mr. Caserta he said, "He truly gave us an example of choosing to serve others over monetary success."

In conclusion, Stephen said, "If we are able to follow this path and incorporate these values which have been taught to us by word and example, then we will truly be successful in life. We will have found the path that will have meaning and bring us true joy and happiness."

Diplomas were presented by Fr. Ken as Principal Chad Riley called each graduate to come forward. Class sponsor Katherine Putnam performed the traditional turning of the rings and moving of the tassels.

Don Miller, superintendent of schools for the Fort Worth Diocese, addressed the graduates. Superintendent Miller told the story of his late wife who had cancer. Just days after her doctor told her she had only a few weeks to live, she scheduled an airline flight for them to Arizona in three months. He asked her if she felt that she would be strong enough. She replied, "Hope is a good thing, maybe the best of all things, and no good thing ever dies." They made the trip to Arizona.

Miller said that his life was changed by his late wife's hope. He advised the graduates, "Sometimes in life things don't go exactly the way you want, but you can't change the past. If you trust, you can change the future. Hope is a good thing. You learned to set goals...figure out how to accomplish them. You never judge a day by what you harvest, but by what you plant."

## County residents complain about uncontrolled canines

Stray dogs in rural areas of Cooke County were the topic of the Public Comment section of the Cooke County Commissioners Court agenda on Tuesday, May 27. Two residents spoke out, but reportedly more have complained to their commissioners about the problem of stray, dumped, or roaming dogs.

Margie Baugh of Moss Lake and Levi Norwood of Gainesville expressed concerns over the dogs. Baugh brought a copy of the State laws on dogs. She asked that the County adopt laws regarding dogs.

Norwood spoke of the dangers and troubles being experienced in rural areas due to stray and roaming dogs that there is no place for in the County. "No person should be afraid to be out for fear of being bitten by an unfamiliar or roaming, stray dog," she remarked. "I urge you to look out for our County citizens by adopting leash laws...our County citizens desire as much right as our city citizens to feel safe."

Dumped dogs were also a concern of Norwood's. She said that a County animal control officer and a place to bring unwanted animals are needed in Cooke County. Norwood said she's heard tales from people all over the County who have trouble with stray dogs.

Precinct #4 Commissioner Virgil Hess commented, "I can't say that we will have an animal control officer, but I'm glad they brought it up now before we get into budget time. Maybe we can look at

getting some sort of solution to that problem. It is getting to be a real problem. Some more people have come talked to me about it."

Precinct #2 Commissioner Steve Key noted that his precinct has a problem also, as people bring the animals from Denton County and dump them in Precinct #2 just across the County line. Commissioner Gary Hollowell suggested they have a discussion on possible options to help resolve the problem.

Sealed bids will be advertised for to do the construction of the interior of the new maintenance facility located in Precinct #4.

Approval was given to advertise for proposals for Financial Audit Services. According to County Auditor Shelley Saunders, it is standard to change audit firms every five years. She said the current firm has been conducting the audit as far back as she could check.

Sealed bids were opened on MC-250, MC-800, MC-3500 Oil, AE-P Emulsified Primer, CRS-2 Emulsified Seal Coat, CRS-2H Emulsified Seal Coat Hot Weather, CSS-IS Emulsified Dust Control, CSS-1H Emulsified Fog Seal to be used by Cooke County for a period of six months beginning May 28, 2008. Bids were submitted by two companies, SEM Materials and Southern Asphalt of Fort Worth. All bids were accepted.

Spending by the 235th District Attorney's office was questioned. Items in question were bottled water which DA Cindy Stormer said was for

the Grand Jury members and some seminars. After some discussion and explanations, no action was taken.

In other business, Commissioners Court:

- Approved out of state travel for County Judge Bill Freeman to attend the National Association of Counties Annual Conference in Kansas City, Missouri July 11-15. This is the closest the conference has been in years, said Judge Freeman.

- Approved waiving delinquent taxes and quitclaim on properties acquired by the City of Gainesville through Sheriff deed and donation.

- Approved renewal of collections contract between Cooke County and Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins, & Mott, L.L.P.

- Approved budget amendment for the Cooke County Maintenance Department for the payment of utility bills. The amount of \$25,000 was approved for transfer from the Contingency Fund to the Maintenance Department. Judge Freeman noted that this was the first year that the bills were all under the Maintenance Department's budget and it was difficult to estimate what they would be.

- Approved a \$10,000 donation for research from Jonathan Finch for the Cooke County Library.

- Approved the Statement of Cooperation between the Cooke County Library and North Central Texas College Library.

- Approved accepting a monetary donation in the amount of \$2,500 from the

Rosalie died at 2:10 a.m. Wednesday morning, May 21, 2008, at her residence.

Born Dec. 21, 1943 in Muenster to John and Catherine Angerer Schmidkofer, Rosalie grew up and completed high school in Lindsay. She then went to Cooke County Junior College and graduated from North Texas State University with a Bachelor's degree in Education. She later earned a Masters degree in Mathematics from Texas Woman's University. She had taught high school Math and Physics in Gainesville, Forestburg, and Sacred Heart, before teaching Math at NCTC for about 12 years.

Rosalie married Gerald Melvin Reiter on Oct. 26, 1963 at Saint Peters Church in Lindsay. They had lived in Muenster for many years before she moved to Gainesville after Gerald's death. She was a lifetime member of the Catholic faith, a member of Sacred Heart Parish.

Rosalie enjoyed reading, watching Dr. Who and many movies with her children and grandchildren. She was a lovely, family oriented lady and will be missed by her family, her many friends, and all who knew her.

Survivors are daughter Loretta Reiter and husband Thai Cao of Plano; sons August Reiter of Dallas, Phillip Reiter and wife Amanda of Lindsay, and Joseph Reiter and wife Stephanie of Carrollton; four grandchildren; brothers and sisters-in-law Joe Schmidkofer and wife Viola of Lindsay, Herbert Schmidkofer of Lindsay, and Leroy Schmidkofer and wife Rosina of Gainesville.

## Fr. Andrew Wewer, OSB 1914 - 2008

Father Andrew Wewer, OSB, monk of Subiaco Abbey, Subiaco, Arkansas, strengthened with the Sacraments and the prayers of his brother monks, died on April 17, 2008. At the time of his death, Father Andrew was 94 years old. He had been a professed monk for 69 years and a priest for 64 years.

Father Andrew died peacefully in the early morning hours of April 17. He had resided in the Abbey Health Center the last 11 years. He was born Jan. 3, 1914 to Joe and Anna Schwierjohann Wewer in Morrison Bluff, Arkansas, and was baptized Emil John Paul.

Emil received his elementary education at Sts. Peter and Paul School in his hometown. Two years of high school followed, one in Scranton and one in Van Buren, Arkansas. He later entered Subiaco Academy, graduating as valedictorian of the class of 1936.

Emil Wewer professed his vows as a monk of Subiaco Abbey on Sept. 15, 1938, receiving the name Andrew. He was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Albert L. Fletcher at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew in Little Rock on June 3, 1943.

Father Andrew taught Latin, German, and mathematics at Subiaco Academy from 1943-48. He then went to Corpus Christi, Texas, where he was a faculty member of Corpus Christi Academy until 1950. He then began his work in pastoral ministry. In Arkansas he was pastor of Sts. Peter & Paul Church in his home parish at Morrison Bluff from 1950-55. He was chaplain at St. Hildegard Hospital in Clarksville, Arkansas, from 1955-58.

For the school year of 1958-59, Father Andrew was again a faculty member of Subiaco Academy, as well as commuting pastor to St. Scholastica Church in Shoal Creek, Arkansas. He then became pastor of St. Benedict Church in Subiaco until 1962. He was assistant pastor at St. Edward Church in Little Rock from 1962-63, and pastor of Holy Redeemer Church in Clarksville, Arkansas, from 1963-64. Father Andrew returned to pastoral ministry in Texas, serving as assistant pastor at Sacred Heart Church in Muenster from 1964-70, and as assistant pastor of St. Mary Church in Fort Worth from 1970-78. He then returned to the ab-

bey where he continued his priestly ministry as a frequent weekend substitute, and for a year served as the retreatmaster at Courty House. He was also a regular confessor for many in the community.

Father Andrew was an artistic craftsman who enjoyed working in the carpenter shop, tackling almost any job requiring technical ability. He was adept at woodcarving, furniture making, and had an innate sense of how to fix moving parts on everything from clocks to organ stops. No project seemed impossible for his multifaceted talent.

For a time he was a licensed ham radio operator and he enjoyed fishing excursions. But games that challenged the mind were his specialty: crossword puzzles and cryptograms were soon deciphered, and then he would spend his time patiently working on jigsaw puzzles ranging from 100 to 6000 pieces. The more complex the puzzle, the more determined effort Father Andrew put into the project.

He was an avid sports fan, and he enjoyed reading the daily newspaper. Gifted with a good sense of humor, this nonagenarian was able to appreciate the ridiculous to the sublime events of the 20th and 21st centuries.

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated April 19.

Miller asked the graduates to take two lessons with them. "Number one, trust in God and in yourself, and secondly, strive always to make those closest to you most proud, and in this order, God, your family, your parish, and your school. You now become a great part of our hope for the future."

Principal Riley shared a poem of a furious battle. A participant at the back of the battle felt his sword wasn't sharp enough to be of use. He threw it down and crept away from the battle. The king's son wounded and with his sharp and shiny sword lost, found the discarded weapon. With new energy, he fought hard and saved the great cause.

"The poet makes a point in his poem that it is not the sword itself which determines whether or not the battle will be won," commented Principal Riley. From Valley Forge to Desert Storm, from San Juan Hill to Operation Joint Guard, the fighting spirit of American soldiers permeates the history of our nation."

"The founders of the United States understood the military would be rampart from which America would guard its freedom. George Washington once stated, 'By keeping up in Peace a well-regulated and disciplined militia, we shall take the fairest and best method to preserve for a long time to come the happiness, dignity, and Independence of our country.' The prophecy of those words has been fulfilled time and again."

"The cost of that vision has been tremendous, for the periods of peace our country has enjoyed are few. The longest time of complete tranquility for our armed forces was the 23 years between World Wars One and Two. Since the Revolutionary War, more than 42 million men and women have served in our military. More

than 600,000 of those countless, selfless warriors died in combat.

"But why are we so willing to fight and, if need be, to die? The answer to that question is simple - and yet as complex as the soul of America itself. We fight because we believe. Not that war is good, but that sometimes it is necessary. Our soldiers fight and die not for the glory of war, but for the prize of freedom. The words of the philosopher John Stuart Mill say it best: 'War is an ugly thing, but not the ugliest of things. The decayed and degraded state of moral and patriotic feeling which thinks nothing is worth war is much worse. A man who has nothing for which he is willing to fight: nothing he cares more about than his own personal safety;

is a miserable creature who has no chance of being free...'

"As we remember these brave warriors and their comrades in arms on this Memorial Day, we must look to the future as well as the past. In today's world, freedom comes cloaked in uncertainty. America still relies on her sons and daughters to defend her liberty. The cost of independence remains high, but we are willing to pay it. We do not pay it gladly, but we pay it with deep reverence and thanks to those who have sacrificed their lives for America."

Christy Hesse then led the assembly in singing "God Bless America" before the Post Rifle Squad gave the traditional 21 Gun Salute in memory of their fallen comrades.

Ronnie and Tina Weinzapfel gave the final salute to

## TDA awards \$1 million to remove and control Tex. feral hogs

The Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) recently awarded Texas AgriLife Extension Service \$1 million for the agency's new Texas Feral Hog Control Program: Moving Towards A Long-Term Abatement Strategy.

Texas is home to more than two million feral hogs, the largest feral hog population in the U.S., and their numbers continue to increase due to high reproductive potential and the lack of natural predators.

Feral hogs wreak havoc on property, livestock, crops, and pastures across the state, and frustrate landowners because of their destructive nature. In fact the Extension Service estimates the statewide annual economic damage caused by feral hogs is close to \$52 million.

The 80th Legislature directed this \$1,000,000 in funding following a \$500,000 pilot project funded by the 79th Legislature. The pilot program was administered by Texas AgriLife Extension Service and Texas Tech University through a TDA grant in 2006-07 and did provide technical assistance to landowners at three sites, and promote educational events for other landowners statewide. The pilot project succeeded in removing more than 3,000 feral hogs, saving landowners/agricultural producers nearly \$3 million in losses.

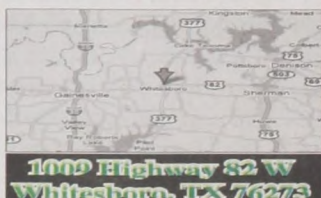

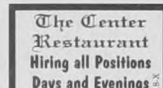

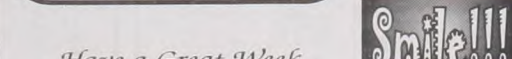

If a hearing request is timely filed, the executive director will complete

the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments.

After the final deadline for public comments following any required Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or is on a mailing list for this application.

**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING** You may request a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. which may be impacted by the facility. If the request is made by a group or an association, the one or more members who have standing to request a hearing and the interests which the group or association seeks to protect, must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.

If a hearing request is timely filed, additional notice may be provided. Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. 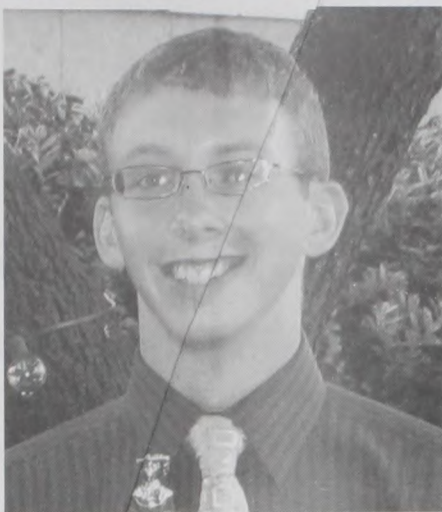
# Sacred Heart Valedictorian Salutatorian

It is Stephen's career objective to obtain a degree in the field of Petroleum Engineering from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette.

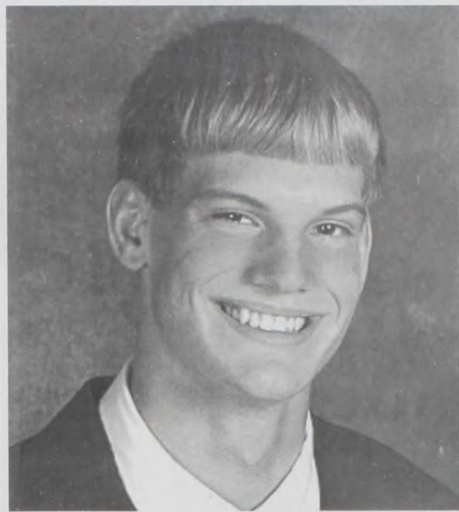

Joshua was very active in athletics. He served as team captain of the varsity football team for two years. He was named 1st Team All-State Running Back, 1st Team All-




