Need of keeping local control stressed at Groundwater Committee meeting

It was decision day for members of the Cooke County Groundwater Conservation Committee appointed by Cooke County Commissioners Court. It is a 12 member committee with a representative from each of the 11 water purveyors (municipal and private) in the County and one representative for the rural landowners. They met Tuesday, Feb. 17 and were asked to rank four choices as to the type

of district they felt Cooke County should seek as its PGMA (Priority Groundwater Management Area). AgriLife Extension Agent Wayne Becker chaired the committee. Greg Bohl was Muenster's voting member and Kenny Klement represented rural landowners.

Public comments were accepted at the start of the meeting. Board members were allowed to make their views known. After ballots with com-

ments were collected, Becker remarked, "Our purpose as a committee is fulfilled." Their purpose was to study the situation and make recommendations to Commissioners Court.

Becker said that he will have a full report ready for the Court meeting on Monday, Feb. 23 at 10 a.m.

"The meeting was very contentious," Becker remarked. "Words were exchanged among Board members and the crowd."

Cooke County reinstates ban on outdoor burning

Cooke County residents' reprieve on the ban on outdoor burning ended at 10 a.m. Friday, Feb. 13, after just being lifted on Monday, Feb. 9. Commissioners Court lifted the ban that had been in place since Nov. 24 to give rural residents the opportunity to burn bothersome

trash that accumulated. It was with some apprehension that the Court lifted the Burn Ban.

Cooke County Emergency Management Coordinator Ray Fletcher remarked, "We have responded to 11 fires since it was lifted and all were the result of careless burning! Four homes were directly, threatened but thanks to the fast work of the firefighters all were saved."

County Judge Bill Freeman reacted to the rash of fires caused by careless burning in the manner he promised when the ban was lifted. He declared an emergency disaster and again placed the unincorporated areas of the County under a Burn Ban.

Commissioners Court held a special called meeting on Tuesday, Feb. 17 to officially place a ban on outdoor burning. Judge Freeman was absent for the meeting. All four commissioners voted for the Burn Ban.

Precinct #4 Commissioner Leon Klement remarked that with the humidity level again falling, it was time to

put the ban back in place. He said that a number of people expressed gratitude for being allowed the opportunity to burn trash during the period that the humidity was up.

Precinct #2 Commissioner Steve Key noted that there were quite a few fires in his precinct during that time. "We didn't get as much rain,"

Leonard Vogels are chosen as Sacred Heart Catholic School's 2009 honorees

Each year, Sacred Heart Catholic School selects either a member of its faculty or a volunteer to be honored for Outstanding Service. The Award is presented in conjunction with Catholic Schools Week and bestowed at the Annual Diocesan Catholic Schools Banquet. Leonard and Christel Vogel shared the 2009 honor.

This year, the banquet was held on Jan. 31 at the Fort Worth Convention Center. Each of the 19 Catholic schools in the Fort Worth Diocese selected an honoree who was awarded a Diocese of Fort Worth Outstanding Service Award. Bishop Kevin Vann presented the awards.

Sacred Heart was well represented at the event. "I am happy to announce that Sacred Heart won the Spirit Award from the Diocese of Fort Worth for having the most attendees at the banquet. We had 55 attendees," noted SHCS Principal Chad Riley.

Although Leonard and Christel have no children of their own, they take a great interest in Sacred Heart School and the welfare of its students. They willingly work at fundraisers sponsored by the Alumni group and attend many of the school's activities. The couple donated \$10,000 to establish the Leonard and Christel Vogel Endowed Scholarship Fund.

On Tuesdays and days when someone else can't be there, Christel takes charge of getting the lunch room salad bar ready. When the need arose to have someone mow the football field, the coaches recruited Leonard. This requires a commitment of two or three times a week when the grass is actively growing. He has even mowed the school grounds, trimmed trees, and pulled out bushes, and hauled off debris when the need arose.

They are also active in the Muenster community, Sacred Heart Parish, and the Cooke County area. Leonard helped ABBA move its crisis pregnancy center to a new location and volunteered to help ABBA assist victims of the June 2007 flooding in Gainesville and Lindsay.

Asked why they choose to volunteer at Sacred Heart Catholic School, Leonard replied, "We feel you are called to do that. That's part of your duties. I think to give back. That's what we are told to do. It makes pretty good sense. People ask you to do things and you do them. If we've got time, which we do, we don't mind giving back."

Christel remarked, "Actu-

ally, it is very enjoyable."

Leonard attended Sacred Heart School. Christel is from Bollendorf, a small town in Germany. She said that after doing office work for 30 years, she wanted to do something different. Christel now works one day a week in a clothing store at the Outlet Mall. "It is something that is fun and a way to be around people," Christel said.

Sacred Heart School track meets are one of the Vogels' favorite volunteer functions. Christel also is especially fond of her volunteer time at the school salad bar. "I like to meet all of the kids. I enjoy meeting the kids. I like to help with the Catholic Daughters' funeral meals. Really anywhere that I meet people, I enjoy that."

Leonard said that when people ask them to do things when they need help, they respond if they've got time. It might be helping haul off tree branches from the parish grounds or helping paint a mural on Main Street or assisting with some project, if Leonard has time, he is willing to give assistance and even use some of his equipment if needed.

Christel commented, "I think volunteer work is very rewarding. If there would be more people who would try it, they would find out how rewarding it is."

Leonard added, "I think it would be nice if some of the younger people would get involved. You don't have to have white hair to do some volunteering!"

Christel summed it up with, "It just makes you feel good if you do something for someone or when you can help somebody else. You are helping them, but you are really helping yourself because it just makes you feel good."

Pallbearers were Micah

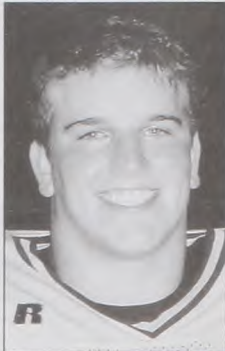

he said. "We have a number of subdivisions surrounded by dry brush and dry grass." Fletcher offered the following tips for when the ban is lifted next time:

- NEVER leave a fire unattended!
- ALWAYS have a means to control or extinguish the fire should it get out of hand!
- Check the weather forecast for winds and humidity prior to burning and for the ensuing two days. If winds and or humidity levels are in the dangerous range, do not start a controlled burn. (National Weather Service Fire Weather Briefing - <http://www.srh.noaa.gov/fwd/firebrief3.php?loc=nort>)
- Notify the Sheriff's Office of your controlled burn at 665-3471.

Blunder - A drink is spilled on the carpeting.

Solution: Prepare an inexpensive all-purpose solution prior to the party by filling a clean spray bottle with warm water. Add a few drops of dish soap and shake. If a spill should occur on carpeting, clothing, tablecloths, couches or virtually any surface, spray the cleaning solution on the affected area and blot with a clean cloth. Repeat if the stain is stubborn.

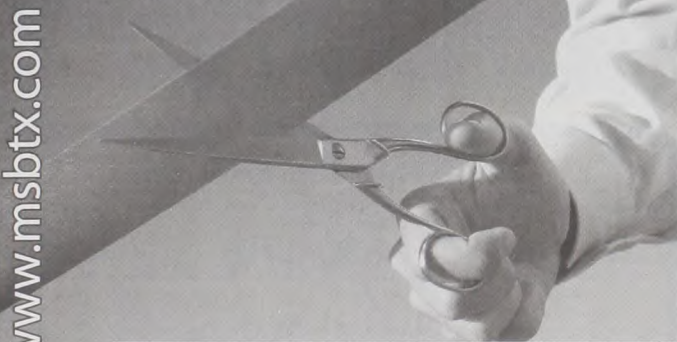

Vietnam veterans remember Fleitman



Three veterans of the Vietnam War recently decided to visit the grave of a fallen friend and comrade. From left, Weldon Vogel, David Fisher, and Walter Lutkenhaus visited the Shiloh Cemetery north of Muenster where Glenn Fleitman is buried. Fleitman served in Vietnam beginning in January 1969. On Feb. 23, 1969, he suffered an injury to his left leg from a metal fragment. This occurred while his unit engaged a hostile force in combat. According to an article in the Muenster Enterprise, in May, Fleitman was promoted to staff sergeant with Company D, 1st Battalion, 28th Infantry, 1st Division. Another article in the Enterprise reported, "Staff Sgt. Glenn Ray Fleitman died June 8, 1969, as the result of wounds received in action on the same date. He was wounded while in combat operation when a hostile force was encountered. He was admitted to a military facility in Vietnam and expired shortly thereafter." Fleitman, Vogel, Fisher, and Lutkenhaus were all in Vietnam during the same period and all grew up in Muenster. According to Lutkenhaus, Cooke County lost a total of six residents in Vietnam. Fleitman was the only one from Muenster. He was the son of the Albert Fleitmans and had a wife Judy. Vogel's nephew Dale Vogel drove the group to the cemetery and took pictures of them there.

Librarians then electronically send the voting totals to the TLA committee. The book that receives the most votes is named the Texas Bluebonnet Award Winner.

At the Muenster ISD Library, the third through sixth grade students are introduced to the 20 books on the current Bluebonnet Book list in August and they have until Jan. 31 to read at least five of those books to be considered eligible voters.
