

New building to relieve Cooke County Electric's growing pains

Cooke County Electric Cooperative Association (CCECA) resolved to find a solution to its expansion problems.

our members and that is our highest priority.
The new building is in the process of being erected just east of the CCECA office building located off of Hwy. 82.

will be installed within the next month and a half and will then be read or "pinged" from the office also.

It includes a parking area to accommodate a large portion of its fleet of trucks and utility vehicles.

According to Neil Hesse, CCECA manager, "We have four or five or six bays out here for trucks to park in and we haven't parked one in there in a year and a half to two years because we have materials housed in there.

Plans for the future include an Emergency Operational Center to be the nucleus of an outage management system.

"CCECA's meters have increased from 12,000 in 1998 to over 15,000 today. Our assets have doubled in the same time period and have gone from \$26,000,000 to over \$52,000,000.

Also housed in this office will be system mapping and automated meter reading.

Covered storage areas in the building will protect inventory from damage by the weather.

With the expanded space, linemen will have staging areas that enable them to organize and prepare daily construction and repair jobs with much less hassle.

There are plans to install a pole-top training and rescue area, allowing CCECA to host pole climbing schools in the future.

Completion of the new facility should occur in late November.

DPS wants drivers and passengers to make the wise, and least expensive choice of finding a sober ride to their destinations during the Labor Day weekend.

All available troopers will be on duty starting Friday, Sept. 4, through midnight, Monday, Sept. 7, looking for drunk drivers, speeders, and seat belt violators.

"Drivers and their passengers should choose a safe ride to wherever they're going this weekend," said Assistant Director David Baker, who oversees the Texas Highway Patrol.

A DWI conviction stays on an offender's criminal and driving record forever. For the first offense, the law allows a maximum of six months in jail, a \$2,000 fine, and a one-year driver license suspension.

DPS supports the "Drink. Drive. Go to Jail." campaign and is also a participant in Operation CARE-Combined Accident Reduction Effort - a nationwide effort by police agencies to reduce fatalities on major interstate highways during holiday weekends.

"Choose a sober driver this weekend," said Assistant Director Baker. "Otherwise, the Texas Highway Patrol will choose your ride for you."





## Learn more about gardening at the Fall Garden Fest Sept. 12

The Cooke County Master Gardeners are hosting their second annual Fall Garden Fest. This program is a half-day seminar that addresses local gardening interests and issues.

The Fall Garden Fest is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 12, from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. It will be held at the North Central Texas College's Little Theater. There will be an excellent assortment of breakfast snacks, door prizes, and a noon meal. It is the Cooke County Master Gardener's annual fundraiser, with tickets \$15 in advance and \$18 at the door.

The theme for this year is "Going Green." Three exciting speakers will cover a variety of topics that will help make your home landscape a greener place.

First, local expert Ashley Hartman will speak on "Edible Plants in the Land-

scape." Ashley is the horticulture instructor at North Central Texas College. Those who have participated in her classes or have heard her speak quickly become fans of her enthusiastic presentation style.

Next, Roger Sanderson from the Heard Museum will speak about "Using Native Plants in the Landscape." Native plants can help reduce inputs like fertilizer and pesticides, while helping to increase the success rate at planting time. Roger is involved daily with native plant restoration projects and is very knowledgeable on both plant varieties and plant establishment.

Finally, Dr. Doty Woodson will be speaking about "Resource Efficient Plants and Landscape Practices." Doty is somewhat of a North Texas celebrity. She gained notoriety as a horticulture expert

while working as a County Extension agent in Tarrant County. She is currently a water resource specialist for the Texas AgriLife Extension Service at the Urban Resource Center in Plano. Doty's knowledge and excitement will make learning about useful landscape practices and adapted plants for the Cooke County area a joy for all who have horticultural interests.

not to place stickers on items that will cause damage, decreasing the value.

There is no rule on prices. Some go by what they would

be willing to pay. Remember, a garage sale is not an antique store and not everything old is valuable. People expect bargains at garage sales.

Get the word out. Being on the Chamber's Garage Sale map lets everyone know where the sales are.

Put out enough signs so drivers can spot them, not by the curb where parked cars block the sign. Keep the signs simple - "Garage Sale" and a big arrow if you are off the main streets.

How you display your goods makes a big difference in sales. Group items in categories such as clothes, housewares, toys, and books. Arrange tables so shoppers can visually see items. If short on tables, display on stacked boxes or use ladders as shelves. People don't like to dig through boxes of mixed junk.

Make sure you have enough bags so people can carry home their purchases. And have plenty of small bills and coins to make change.

When people arrive, greet them and be approachable,

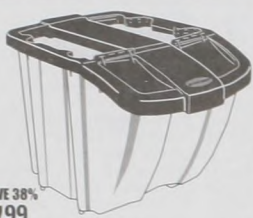

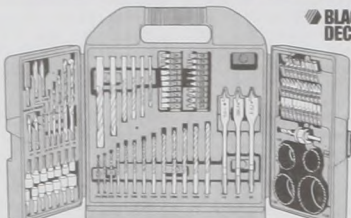

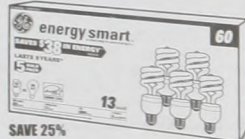

## No cell phones in school zones

New state legislation aims to improve child safety. Beginning Tuesday Sept. 1, 2009, law enforcement will start issuing citations for use of cell phones and other similar electronic devices in school zones where signs outlawing their use are posted. Signs are already in place near many schools.

HB 55 makes it illegal to use a wireless communication device in a school zone unless the vehicle is stopped or a hands-free device is used. Cities or counties wanting to enforce this law must post a sign at the beginning of each school zone to inform drivers that using a wireless communications device is prohibited and the operator is subject to a fine. It is a defense to prosecution if the operator was making an emergency call.

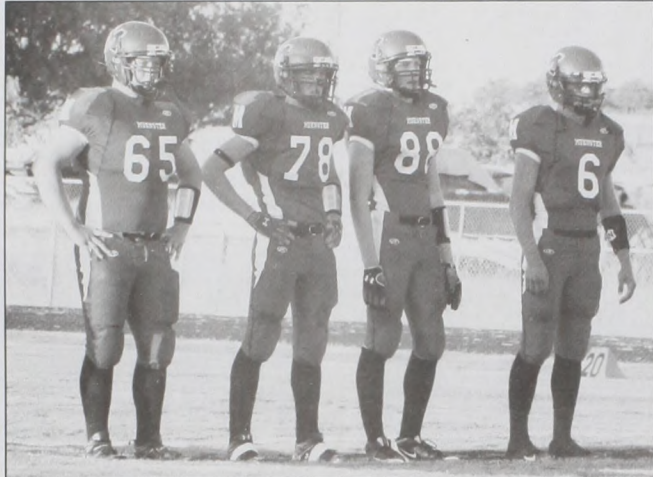
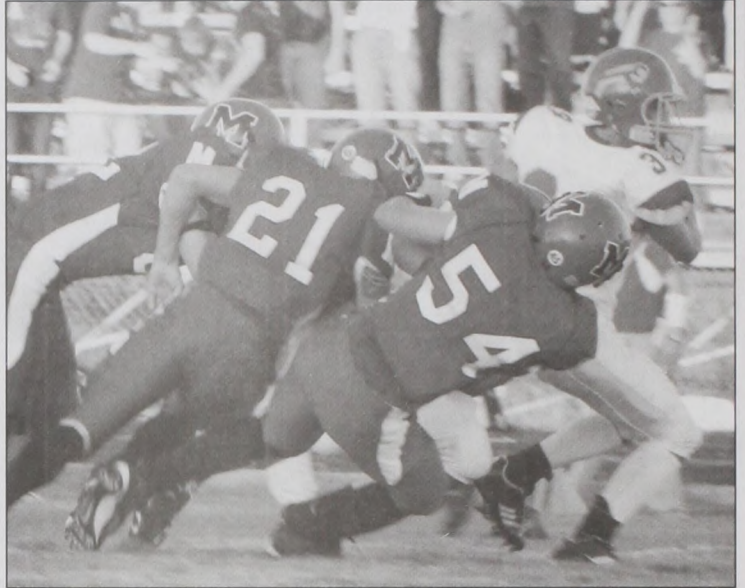

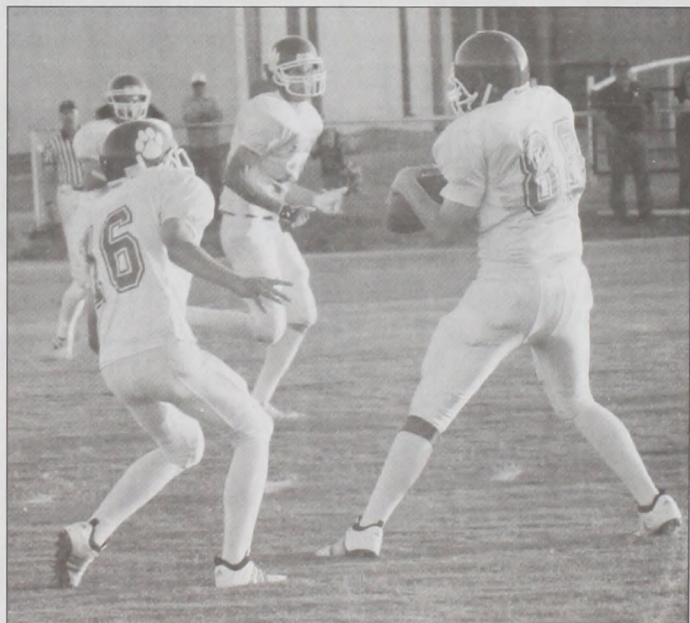
