Freeman announced Mon-
day that his pending resignation from office is effective
May 29 . May 29. . I do with a lot of

while I am young enough
and healthy enough to be and healthy enough to be
able to enjoy a few years of
my retirement," remarked Judge Freeman.
With a year and seven With a year and seven
months remaining on Judge
Freeman's term, Commissioners will have the job of
appointing his replacement. Commissioners Court had
decided to take applicadecided to take applica-
tions concerning the county
judge's job. Applications are judge's job. Applications are
available at the HR (Humana
Resources) Resources) Department lo-
cated on the second floor of Prosperity Bank. All appli-
cations will be reviewed by the Court in an executive
session and a decision made in future weeks.
Qualifications for county Qualifications for county
judge include: be a resident of the State of Texas for at
least one year least one year; a resident of
Cooke County for at least six
months; and you cannot be a convicted felon. Judge Freeman noted that it is an administrative office
only. There are no judicial functions at all.
In his personal opinion, the best qualifications for someone to become county
judge include, "Some kind of experience in preparing
and managing large bud-
gets. They would need some
