Heller resigns from Muenster Hospital administrative seat

Members of the Muenster Memorial Hospital Board of Directors received a shock during the executive session of the Dec. 21 regular Board meeting. Administrator Lynn Heller tendered his resignation to retire effective immediately.

Chief Operating Officer (COO) in training Michael Kent was authorized to serve as interim COO. Kent served MMH as the director of Radiology. He is also their Information Technology specialist and is the driving force in bringing the Hospital into Electronic Health Record (EHR) usage.

Following the executive session, the Board awarded Heller a bonus regarding performance and goals attained in 2010.

Net revenues for the month of November totaling \$570,768 with operating expenses totaling \$670,739 for a net operating revenue in November of negative \$99,971. Revenues of \$35,711 from ad valorem taxes brought the excess of revenues over expenses to a negative \$64,260 for November 2010.

In November, there were 79 ER visits, 334 outpatients, 533 visits to the Family Health Clinic, and 766 Home Health visits. Percent of occupancy in the Hospital was 31.67%. There were 16 acute care and long term care admissions combined for an average daily census of 5.70, and a combined average length of stay of 15.35 days. Long term care averaged 30.86 days.

Dr. Stephen Jones was elected as chief of the medical staff and Dr. Mario Roa as vice-chair. The Board approved this election.

A policy for FIT Center corporate sales gained Board approval. This allows a discount for corporate/business/group memberships to the MMH FIT Center when certain requirements are met. Discounts range from 10% to 20% depending on membership numbers joining.

The Board approved physician privileges as recommended by the Medical Staff. These include active privileges to James S. Jones, M.D. and Mario Roa, Jr., M.D. and courtesy privileges in Radiology to Richard Abramson, M.D., Suzanne Aquino, M.D., Mark Boykin, M.D., Shannon Calhoun, D.O., Sinclair Cottingham, M.D., Marissa Camrud, M.D., Lillian Cavin, M.D., and Eric Crowder, M.D., in

Cardiology to M. Asad, M.D., and in Emergency Room to Kevin Funk, M.D.

In other business, the MMH Board:

- Approved Bad Debt Write Offs totaling \$4,462.09.
- Approved amendment to the personnel policies regarding non harassment.
- Approved a Social Media policy to provide Hospital District employees with requirements for participation in social media, including District-hosted social media, and in non-District social media in which the employee's Muenster Hospital District is known, identified, or presumed.
- Approved amendment to Medical Staff Bylaws regarding signature stamps and entries into the Medical Record.
- Authorized the administrator to obtain bids for the remodeling work in the Rural Health Clinic building.

After 29 days, County Commissioners lift outdoor burn ban

Burning trash, brush piles, etc. can be done again by residents of Cooke County without fear of a fine. The County-wide burn ban put in place by Commissioners Court on Dec. 13 was lifted at the regular Commissioners Court meeting held Monday, Jan. 10.

Precinct #1 Commissioner Gary Hollowell and Precinct #2 Commissioner B.C. Lemons both favored lifting the ban to allow people to burn their trash. County Judge John Roane offered documentation that favored removing the ban. According to the Keetch Byram Drought Index (KBDI), Cooke County is no longer in a drought. It is colored light and dark blue, indicating plenty of moisture.

The Court was unanimous in the vote to lift the burn ban. It can be reinstated if the need arises.

Cooke County Sheriff Mike Compton reported on the County Jail population for December as an overall average of 123 prisoners with an out-of-County average of 27 and the County average of 97. Money coming in for December was \$30,900. Counties sending prisoners, the number of prisoners, and money received were: Wichita seven for \$7,575 and Denton 20 for \$23,325. He said that January's average so far is up one to 124 with an out-of-County average of 24.

Judge Roane announced the anticipated completion date of the Courthouse is October. Commissioner Klement said that they are now beginning to re-stucco some of the ceilings, and scaffolding is being erected.

Commissioner Al Smith remarked, "I think it's a Herculean management job for these two guys to pull it off period, and I think that if it's done in 2011, we'll be really happy be-

cause it's so big. This is a difficult management job. You're not in charge, the State of Texas is basically in charge and it's hard to get things done. I think they're doing a good job."

In other business, Commissioner Court:

- Proclaimed Monday, Jan. 17 as Martin Luther King, Jr. Day in Cooke County, recognizing his contributions to African Americans in this country as a whole.
- Approved indigent burial of Joseph Martinez, Jr.
- Approved interlocal agreements with the Valley View Volunteer Fire Department and the Lindsay Volunteer Fire Department.
- Approved change order number 8 and number 10 for the Cooke County Courthouse.

Esther enjoyed, most of all, attending football games, rooting for the teams coached by her son. She also loved attending games played by her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She enjoyed fishing, dominos, watching the Rangers and Cowboys, and cooking, especially her famed banana pudding. She and Royce traveled quite often to various places, staying in their camper.

At the funeral service, Esther's good friend Carol Dyer provided comforting piano selections. Rev. Gourley spoke of Esther, commenting that from the moment you met her, you knew she was a special person. He told of

her deep devotion to her husband, and of her abiding faith in God her father and Jesus her savior. Esther's daughter Wanda remembered her mother as the most caring mother anyone could have, and that her parents loved each other so deeply, they truly were as one.

Highway Patrol troopers arrest more than 1,100

A special enforcement program targeting impaired drivers during the Christmas and New Year's holidays was successful in removing more drunk drivers off Texas roadways.

Texas Highway Patrol troopers arrested 1,106 drivers across Texas for driving while intoxicated during the holiday period from Dec. 21 to Jan. 1. Of those arrests, 442 were made by troopers whose patrols were funded through a Texas Department of Transportation grant targeting impaired driving in high-risk locations during the times when alcohol-related

crashes occur most frequently.

"The special grant allowed us to stay out on the road longer, and arrest more drunk drivers," said David Baker, assistant director for the Texas Highway Patrol. "We were able to arrest 288 more people in 2010 than in 2009. As always, the Highway Patrol urges you to designate a sober driver if you are going to drink alcohol."

The \$2 million special mobilization grant will run throughout 2011, allowing DPS to have additional targeted DWI patrols during Spring Break, Independence Day, and Labor Day.

Letter to the Editor

To the Editor:

First, I want to make it clear that I am not a personal friend of either Judge Roane or Steve Gaylord and that my comments are intended as strictly impartial. I consider both Judge Roane and Mr. Gaylord to be political friends in spite of any differences in our opinions or support of political candidates. I met Judge (then Justice of the Peace) Roane several years ago when we both served on the Cooke County Home Hospice Advisory Committee. I learned to admire and respect then J.P. Roane for his genuine concern and interest in this community and its residents. I met Steve Gaylord a few years later when we had strong differences over a certain political issue. After discussing our differences, we recognized our individual right to support or protest against political issues, shook hands, and agreed to respect those differences over any future issues.

I agree with Mr. Terry Wyatt that personal attacks against a protestor - if those attacks are not germane to the issue - do not justify labeling the protestor with a derogatory connotation. Further, such "labeling" detracts from the real issue and weakens the attacker's attempt to discredit the protestor's differences. It can also leave the impression that the attacker is unable to present valid contradictions to the opinions offered by the protestor.

I voted for and have supported John Roane as our County Judge. I believe that Judge Roane and our Commissioners should respect the right of Cooke County individuals to agree or disagree with the political issues on which our Commissioners must make their decisions. I believe that these individuals should have the respect of the Commissioners' Court as long as the respect is mutual. Neither our political office holders nor the citizens of this county should forget that we should all want what is best for this county and its residents. Our country was not built upon a foundation of "follow the leader" or "political correctness." It was built upon our ancestors' freedom to protest against political issues with which they disagreed.

GO FISHING FACTS

What attracts fish to spinner baits? The flash and the vibrations in the water. You can make your spinner vibrate more by bending open the V-shaped angle between the blade and the hook.

Most fish lines can absorb 10 to 30% more weight than their "test" weight before breaking.

If you are lucky enough to catch a 50 pound catfish, it

is likely to be 30 to 50 years old.

Wood crank baits are hard to find. They tend to wobble more slowly on retrieve than plastic ones, getting more strikes.

Never run a stringer through the gills of a fish. That will make your catch rapidly drown.

Tie stringers of fish where

they can swim deeper to seek cooler water.

Hooks - shorter, sturdier points tend to be stronger, but require a harder hook set to penetrate the jaw of the fish. Narrower, thinner points can be easily set, but they are weaker and easier to break.

Bass grow faster in warmer climates.
