



## Glara Waltersckeid proclaims life good at 100

Muenster native Clara Walterscheid reached a milestone that most people do not. She celebrated her 100th birthday on Sunday,

Clara was born on Dec. 6, 1914 in Muenster to Henry and Anna Lummel Pels. Since Dec. 6 is the feast of St. Nick, she said her parents would have named her Nicholas had she been a boy.

Growing up on a farm located northwest of Muenster, Clara learned at an early age how to do her share to get the farm chores done. She was the third oldest of nine children - seven girls and two boys.

"We had a horse and a cart to get to school in," recalled Clara. "I had to go and hitch up the horse to the cart and drive it an hour on the road every morning to get to school." She added that when it was cold, they just bundled up to stay warm.

There were some chores done before school, but much more when they arrived home from a day at school. Chores included gathering eggs, feeding chickens, and rounding up and milking cows. After Paul's death on Feb. 4, 1988, Clara continued to live there.

U.S. wheat is genetically modified. Rubbish. In fact, there is no genetically modified wheat commercially

Wheat makes Americans fat. Balderdash. Eating too much of anything and lack of exercise make you fat. Wheat plays no special role in putting on pounds.

Americans eat more wheat than ever before. Malarkey. U.S. wheat consumption is about half of what it was in the 1870s.

Wheat is drenched in pesticides before harvesting. Baloney. Less than 2% of the crop is sprayed with herbicide about a week before harvest to help the wheat dry

Modern wheat contains more gluten. Poppycock. A USDA research scientist found gluten content in wheat has not increased in the last two centuries.

Should we eat more whole grains? Yes. Should we cut down on processed foods? Probably. Sort through the rubbish and

#### **Farmers** committing suicide

Do you know of someone who needs help but won't seek it on his or her own? Driving the best pickup or the latest piece of farm machinery doesn't always tell the whole story.

Newsweek's cover story in early April didn't mince any words.

"Death on the Farm," the cover headline read. "Farmers are a dying breed, in part because they're killing themselves in record numbers."

In reality, farmer suicide is nothing new.

According to Newsweek's article, people began talking about farming suicides during the 1980s farm crisis. By 1985, 250 farms across the country went into foreclosure every hour, pushing many farmers to resort to suicide.

Author Terezia Farkas notes, suicide rates among farmers are the highest of any occupation. Male farmers have a suicide rate approximately two times that of the general population.

The problem isn't confined to American soil. In France, a farmer succumbs to suicide every two days. India has reported more than 270,000 farmer suicides since 1995. Similar statistics exist for China, Ireland, the United Kingdom, Australia – the list goes on.

## Use care decking the halls

As you deck your halls this holiday season, make sure to keep fire safety in mind. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), home candle and decoration fires peak in December. Nearly half of all holiday decoration fires occur because the decorations are placed too close to a heat source, with two out of every five home decoration fires started by candles.

December is the leading month for home candle fires; Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day are the top three days of the year for such fires.

To help keep your home and loved ones safe from fire when decorating this holiday season, NFPA offers the following tips and recommen-

#### **Candles**

- 12" away from decorations and anything else that can
- Use candle holders that are sturdy and won't tip over easily; put candle holders on a stable, uncluttered sur-
- Blow out all candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Avoid the use of candles in the bedroom and other areas where people may fall asleep.

**Christmas Trees** 

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that don't fall off when touched.
- in a stand, cut 2" from the ing home or going to bed. base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, including fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents, or lights.
- Make sure the tree isn't son. blocking any exits (i.e., a door or a window).
- Add water to the tree stand daily.

- Use lights that include the label of a recognized testing laboratory.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for usage; some lights are designed for indoor or outdoor use, not
- · Replace any string of • Keep lit candles at least lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Connect no more than three strands of mini light sets and a maximum of 50 bulbs for screw-in light bulbs. Read the manufacturer's instructions for the number of LED strands to connect.

- Use clips (not nails) to hang lights so the cords don't get damaged.
- Turn off all light strings Before placing the tree and decorations before leav-




