





Next Thursday, August 22, begins the new scholastic year at both Muenster schools. According to schedules announced by Father Bruno Fuhrmann and L. B. Bruns, superintendents of the parochial school and the public school, registration will be held on Thursday and classwork will start on Friday. The first day will be a short one. Busses will run an hour behind usual schedule, getting the students to school about 9 o'clock. The plan is to finish registrations about 11 and dismiss students in time to get home for their noon meals. Lunch rooms will not be open the first day.
