## Many Changes in Phone Directory Follow Line Work

A list showing lots of changes of numbers will be included with the next monthly bills of the Muenster Telephone Corporation. Those numbers, applying to the Muenster and Forestburg exchanges, are the result of additions and improvements to the lines and will be used until the new auto-

Changes apply mostly to rural lines, and were required to reach new customers as well as to relieve the overload on other lines. The lines serving one to four parties were not affected, hence their numbers are not changed. Another reason for changes is the removal of the last of the magneto type phones on the system. Hereafter no one will have to crank his phone to reach the opera-

The phone system's management urges immediate use of the new list of numbers as a means of saving time for both patrons and operators. Asking for old numbers will require the operator to delay until she can look up the change on her list. If operators have to look up the changes repeatedly, especially at rush time, the service will be noticeably slowed

down for all. It is suggested, therefore, that the new list be consulted first for making a call. If the wanted party's name is not there the number in the old directory still applies.

Another suggestion is that each patron revise the old directory to serve his or her purpose. That is, consult the new list for names of persons frequently called and make the changes in the old directory, thereby bringing it up to date for the home concerned. Otherwise prepare a private list of changes to keep near the phone. But keep the complete revised list handy for checking on numbers less frequently called. A few minutes spent on noting changes can save lots

of time later. The revised list of numbers will be used until the changeover to the dial system. A new directory, to be published shortly before the change-over, will give the list of dial numbers.
