deaths among young childre deaths among young children can be prevented with toxoid. The child who has never been protected should be given this
safeguard against a dreaded killing disease. Even though he may have been immunized as a baby, doctors and health officers usually recommend an additional
dose of toxoid to strengthen immunity before entrance into

## school.

"In addition, before you send your child to school you are urged to take him to your family
physician and dentist for physician and dentist for a
thorough examination," Dr. Cox adds. "You will want to know that he is in good physical condition and can compete with the other children on equal terms. If
the check-up reveals any weak ness or defects they should be corrected at once. Don't let your child start his school life with any avoidable handicap.
