The United States Government Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock, through its Census Bureau Crop Reporting Board issued its final estimate of the 1925-27 cotton crop, and gave report of amount of cotton ginned to December 1st, also its revised estimate as to acreage to be harvesied this season.

The final crop estimated was for a production of 18,618,000 bales as compared with their estimate at the same date last year of 15,602,000 bales. Texas crop was estimated at 14,564,000 bales.
