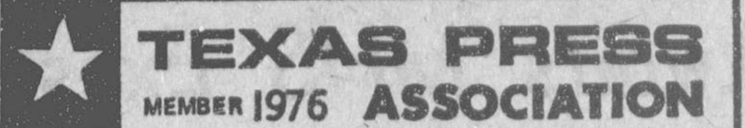

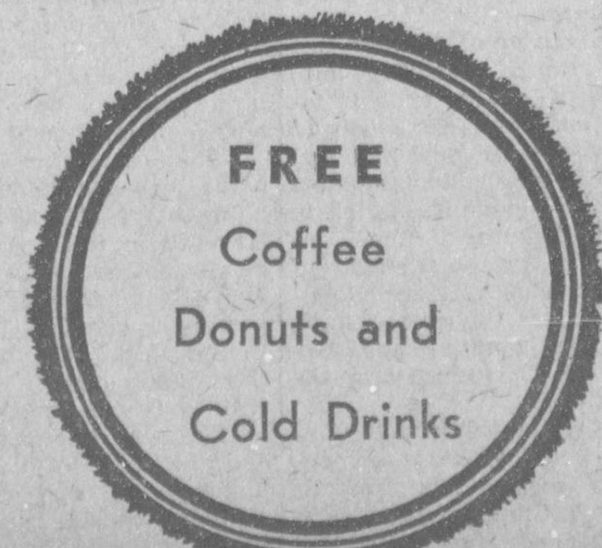

## Faculty Considers Medication Policy HEW Regulations

Discussion of Diocesan Policy No. 22, pertaining to the administration of medication at Sacred Heart School, and of the official HEW statement of student rights and responsibilities were the principal concern of a SH faculty meeting on September 9.

The medication policy provides that medication may be administered to diabetics, epileptics and asthmatics with written permission of parent and physician specifying all conditions relative to the medication. It tells time or circumstance for giving medication, the person responsible for keeping and giving the medication, and various other relative conditions.

The HEW statement spells out the legal rights of students along with related responsibilities. For instance, the school may not interfere with the student's freedom of religion and the student is expected to respect the religious freedom of others.

Also, freedom of speech and expression must be recognized, but the expression must not violate the freedom of others. And the Pledge of Allegiance or Salute to the Flag can not be required of anyone, but dissenters must not disrupt the activity of others who choose to do so.

Regarding suspension, school officials are required to list violations and give the student a chance to be heard. On the other hand students have the responsibility to follow school regulations and not to violate rights of other students.

Also listed are HEW regulations banning discrimination due to race, sex or minority group.

#### ELECCION GENERAL DEL 2 DE NOVIEMBRE DE 1976

##### NUMERO UNO EN LA BOLETA (S.J.R. 49)

Revocando Secciones 49-d and 49-d-1 del Artículo III de la Constitución de Tejas, S.J.R. 49 enmienda Sección 49-c del Artículo III de la Constitución de Tejas para disponer y autorizar \$400 millones adicionales de bonos para el desarrollo de agua en Tejas que se puede emitir a la aprobación de dos terceras partes de los miembros de cada cámara de la Legislatura para tales fines de desarrollo del agua que la Legislatura pueda prescribir.

##### NUMERO DOS EN LA BOLETA (H.J.R. 99)

H.J.R. 99 propone una enmienda a la Constitución de Tejas para aumentar de \$100 millones hasta \$200 millones la cantidad principal agregada de bonos para el desarrollo de agua en Tejas que se puede emitir y que están en circulación por el Texas Water Development Board para proveer donaciones y préstamos para la mejoría de la calidad de agua como establecido por la Legislatura. 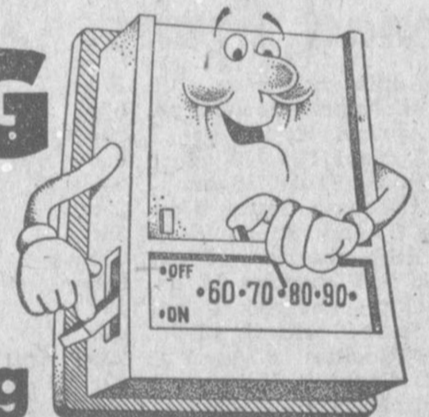

## SAVING TIPS on electric air conditioning



Air conditioning provides lots of comfort during the summer months, but for many thousands of homeowners it is also the biggest factor in the cost of electricity. For example, a 3-ton air conditioning unit uses about fifteen times as much electricity as a color television. The cost of operating a 3-ton unit 18 hours per day is approximately \$3.50. On the average, air conditioning accounts for about half of summertime electric bills.

Here are ways you can hold down the cost of air conditioning and still enjoy its comfort.

#### Central Systems

1. Set thermostat on 78° or higher, during the summer. Turn unit off if you'll be away from home several days.
2. Keep equipment at top operating efficiency. Have it checked seasonally by qualified serviceman.
3. Check filter every 30 days. If filter is permanent, clean by manufacturer's directions; if it's disposable, it should be replaced when dirty.
4. Keep furniture, draperies away from air outlets and returns. Clean grills often.
5. Close draperies and blinds to keep out direct sunlight.
6. Keep fireplace damper closed.
7. Proper home insulation keeps the heat out, cuts energy use. Insulation questions? Call TP&L.
8. Trim trees, shrubs away from outside compressor unit. Keep it free of leaves, debris. If air flow is blocked, unit uses more energy.

9. Weatherstrip doors and windows; caulk cracks to prevent drafts and cool air loss.

10. Keep windows closed. Open outside doors as little as possible

#### Window Units Follow above suggestions, plus these:

11. Buy units with highest "energy efficiency ratio" (EER). Uses less electricity to cool. If EER is not on sales tag, ask for it or figure it yourself. Divide "wattage" into "BTU" capacity. Both figures are on unit.

12. Place unit where it'll get as little direct sun as possible.

13. Never vent air conditioner into garage. Ventilation is usually too poor for top performance of your unit.

Conserve electricity and you help conserve one or more of the fuels needed to produce it. Conserve fuels and you help assure that there will be enough to meet essential needs for electricity in the future.

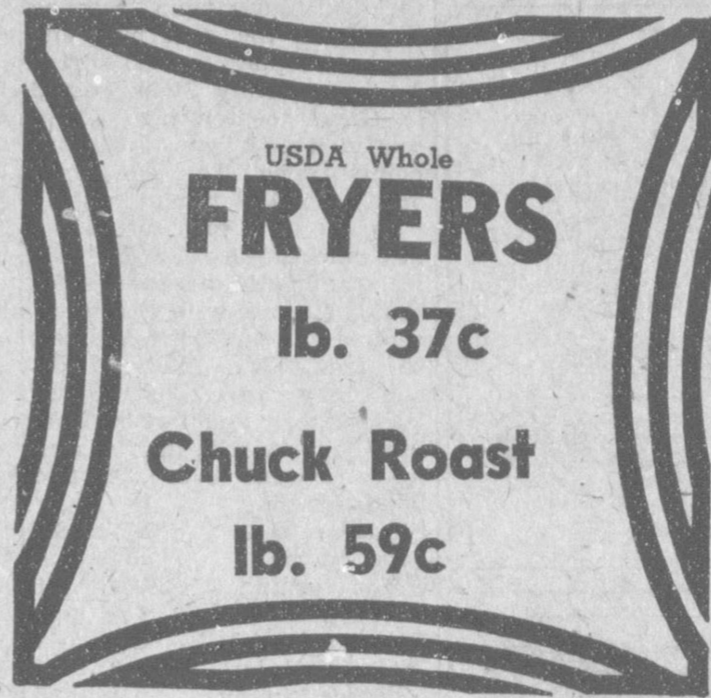

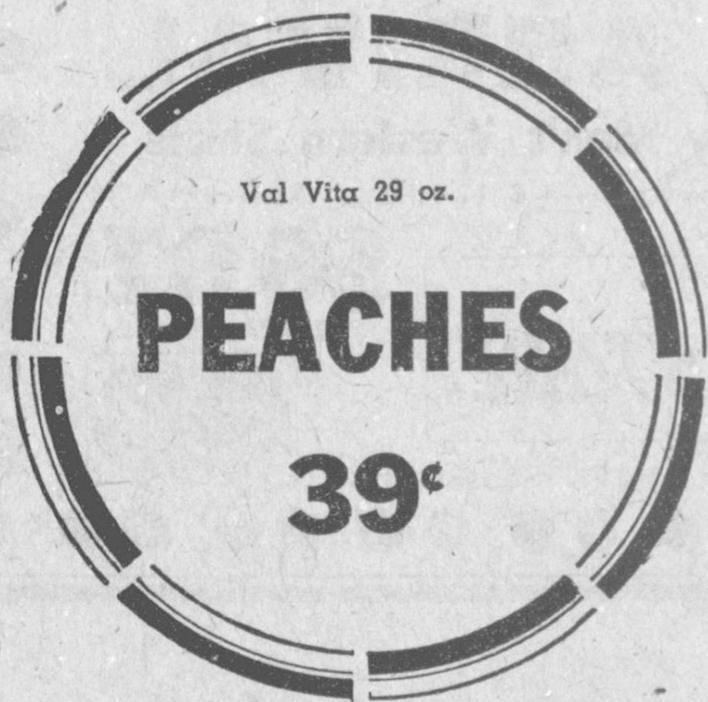
