Muenster's scrap campaign moves forward steadily, according to J. P. Flusche, local chairman, who reported this week that one hundred thousand pounds of scrap has been collected here since the campaign was inaugurated.

35,000 pounds of iron, 1000 pounds of rubber and 100 pounds of other metals. Since that time 65,000 more pounds have been dumped on the scrap heap on south Main street. Several car loads have been shipped and several more are awaiting transfer, Mr. Flusche said. This campaign will continue for the duration, everything that is made of worn out, obselete or unessential metal is needed.


Old garbage cans, hammer-heads, flatirons, skid chains, refrigerators, tractors, washing machines, kitchen stoves, bathtubs, electric appliances, plows, hayracks, rails,

Junked metal will feed hungry steel mills turning out weapons against the axis. It is very important that every ounce of scrap is turned in. Citizens are urged to do this at once.




