When the Hesse family numbered 9 children, they moved to a farm west of town, where the 10th, Meinrad was born. The home they built, now remodeled, still stands on the original site.

In 1924 when Fr. Frowin Koerdt began a new brick school building, Mr. Hesse was present to see the corner-stone laid on the 35th anniversary of the First Mass in the colony. Seven pioneer members were photographed there. This was also the last Mass attended by Mr. Hesse. He died on December 14, 1924. His wife lived on the farm until she died on January 5, 1940.






