





HERE'S HOW For many years, natural gas was the only fuel used to produce electricity at Texas Power & Light Company generating plants. It was plentiful and cheap. But, in recent years uncertain supplies and drastically rising costs of gas have focused attention on readily available, lower-cost lignife coal.

In the late 1960's, TP&L and two affiliated Texas electric companies began a massive program to reduce their dependency on gas by constructing plants to use lignite. The first plant was placed in operation in 1971 and another in 1974. Others are under construction and being planned.

under construction and being planned. During 1976, nearly one-third of the electric power which TP&I. supplied to its customers was produced at lignite-fueled plants and resulted in customer savings of more than \$81 million. The price of electricity must continue to go up, however, because of the high cost of building new plants and other effects of inflation. But, as TP&L generates more and more electricity with lignite coal, the increase in price will be many millions of dollars less than if that electricity were generated with natural gas. with natural gas.


