held on the parking lot in front of the Community Center. The 1976 version included two pageants, a flag presented after it flew over the national capitol, a Miss Muenster contest, won by Barbie
Hess, and the first Fun Run that drew 251 runners. In its four-day sand, it drew about 5,000 visitors.
Favorite topic of conversation the next week was the expert handling of the crowds and the amounts of food and drink con-
