Weekly Update

Texas, October 22 - Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 7.9 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.42/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 9.0 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.67/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 12.9 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 16.0 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 14.2 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 20.1 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"Only one other time in the last few years have we seen the national average drop so significantly in the course of just a week, and that other time was in May 2011," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Looking back at our data, we only see that prices dropped considerably more in autumn 2008 when the economy slipped into a recession. Given the circumstances with this latest weekly decrease - that it has nothing to do with recession - is significant," DeHaan said.

GasBuddy operates, TexasGasPrices.com, and over 225 other local gasoline pricetracking websites that follow prices at over 125,000 gasoline stations in the United States and Canada. GasBuddy also uses Facebook (facebook.com/gasbuddy) Twitter (twitter.com/gasbuddy), and phone apps to keep motorists ahead of changing gasoline prices.

Texas Crop & Weather

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors for October 30, 2012: The region had above-average temperatures at the beginning of the week, but by the weekend, cooler temperatures arrived, with some areas receiving a killing freeze. No moisture was received, and soil moisture continued to be mostly short. Mild weather allowed harvesting of crops. However, very windy weather postponed some harvesting. The corn and grain sorghum harvests, and wheat planting were all ongoing. Producers with irrigation were watering wheat because of the dry weather. Wheat was in mostly fair to good condition. Rangeland and pastures were mostly in very poor to poor condition. Cattle remained in good condition, with continued supplemental feeding.

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors for October 23, 2012: Temperatures were near average for most of the week, with some isolated areas having a hard-enough freeze that not all crops will be salvageable. Soil-moisture levels were mostly short. Producers were very busy with the ongoing corn harvest and starting the grain sorghum and cotton harvests. Winter wheat planting was going at a hectic pace after recent rains. Earlier wheat plantings emerged and were growing. Some producers were irrigating early planted wheat to provide grazing for stocker cattle. Cattle remained in good condition, with supplemental feeding continuing.

Spearman Veterans Day Program Set



Tal Jackson, Major USMC Retired

Local veterans will be honored Friday, November 9th from 9:30-10:30 a.m. in the Spearman Varsity Gym. Speaker for the program will be Mr. Tal Jackson, Major USMC Retired. Jackson graduated from Spearman High School in 1981. He attended Texas Tech University and graduated in 1987 with a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture Economics. He was commissioned a second lieutenant in December of 1987. After completing The Basic School he reported to Naval Air Station Pensacola, Florida for flight training. Upon completion of T-34C training in VT-6, he reported to NAS Beeville, Texas, for intermediate and advanced jet training. Designated a naval aviator in the summer of

1990, he executed orders to MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina, as an AV-8B replacement pilot.

He has served tours with Marine Attack Squadrons VMA-311, VMA-214 and VMA-211. Major Jackson completed two Western Pacific deployments and deployed with the 31st MEU. During these tours, he held billets including Airframes Officer, and Aviation Maintenance Officer.

In 1995, he attended Amphibious Warfare School in Quantico, VA. Returning to the fleet in 1996 he served again with VMA 211 and 214 as the department of Safety and Standardization Officer and Operations Officer. In July of 1999 Major Jackson was assigned to III Marine Expeditionary Force in Okinawa, Japan where he served in current operations. In 2000 he was assigned to MCAS Futenma as the Installatio Logistics and Services officer.

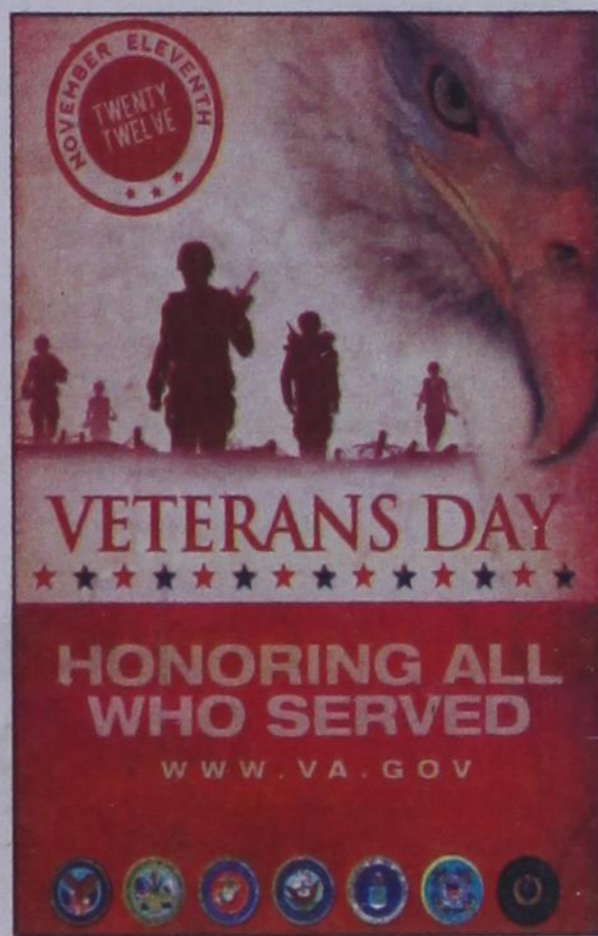
From 2003 to 2005 he served with US Navy's 7th Fleet onboard the USS Blue Ridge home ported in Yokosuka, Japan. With 7th Fleet Major Jackson's billets included Landing Force Plans Officer and Korea Theater Plans Officer.

Major Jackson's final active duty assignment was to Marine Corps Air Station Iwakuni, Japan where he served as VMR Operations Officer, Aviation Safety Officer and Pilot Training Officer.

General Election To Be Held November 6th

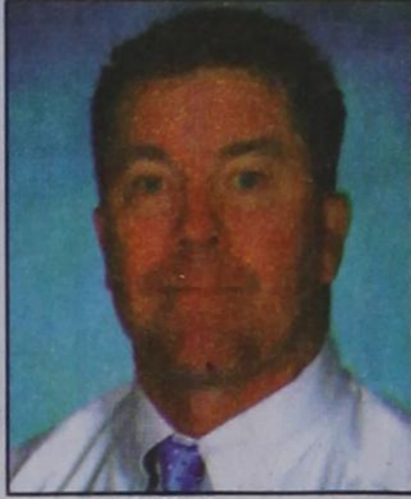

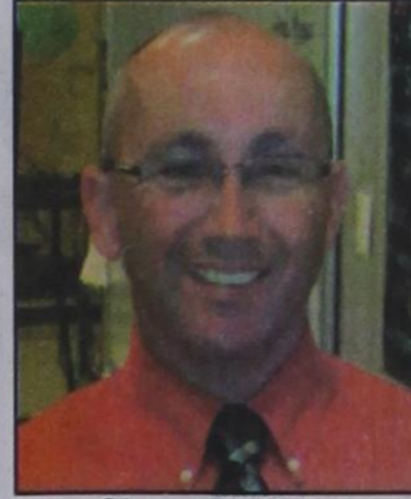

The National Association of Elementary School Principals and the National Association of Secondary School Principals — joined by their state affiliates, the Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association and the Texas Association of Secondary School Principals — have designated the month of October as a time to recognize the contributions of elementary, middle and high school principals.

At this time, I encourage all Texans to recognize the important role principals play in ensuring that every child has access to a high-quality education.
