## Spearman Police To Crack Down On Underage Drivers

The permit requires you to have a person 21 years of age or older with you in the car. The permit is not a license to drive y yourself.
At age 16, you can receive a provisional drivers license if you have had a valid permit for six months. Then for six months with your provisional license,you cannot driv between the hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m. Also during hat six months, you can only have one person under 21 at a time. You have to renew a provisional license every y ear until you turn
ar drivers license.
These laws were put into effect to protect the people of thi tate. Insurance companies will not cover unlicensed driv ers. Underage drivers do not have the experience to make
he decisions necessary when faced with adverse condiions.
The Spearman Police Department has been battling with he underage driving problem for a long time. Just last week here were two hit and run accidents involving underage drivers. They had an accident, and they left the scen because they did not know what to do, and they were afraid.
Many times we do not know the driver of a vehicle does not have a drivers license, however, when we are award tha hey are driving without a license, we have the authority to pull them over. Parents can also be held accountable for allowing their children to drive and can be written a citation

* The tax holiday occurs every year on the first Friday, Saturday, and Sunday of August. Qualifying items are exempt from state sales taxes ince no cities opted out of the holiday, qualifying items will be fully exempt from tax throughout Texas.
rom sales tax. Customers will receive the break on individual item regardless of the total amount they buy. For example, sales tax is no
due if a customer buys six shirts each priced at $\$ 99.99$. But full tax is ane
due on a shirt sold for $\$ 100$; the first $\$ 99.99$ cannot be exempted. * Clothing and footwear used primarily for athletic activities or for
protective wear are not eligible for the exemption. Customers buying golf cleats or football pads, for instance, must pay sales tax. Athletic can qualify for tax exemption. For example, tennis shoes, baseball caps and jogging suits are worn during ever
