# Spearman Woman Aids in Discovery of Vehicle Theft Scheme

The alert and diligent action of Spearman Chief Deputy Tax Assessor Collector Linda Cummings, has been cited as instrumental in the discovery of a vehicle theft ring in Dallas.

Sergeant Neil Lovorn of the Motor Vehicle Theft Service of the Texas Department of Public Safety credited the Spearman official's actions of May 21, 2001, with the information that led to the confiscation of three stolen vehicles in Spearman and two other vehicles and one engine from outside the area.

In seeking to help a Spearman couple with the title application for a vehicle on May 21, 2001, Cummings became concerned when a computer check showed a previous vehicle title had been issued to Jose Gonzalez in the Dallas area on May 5,

"Some of the state computer information on ownership and dates of the vehicle did not correspond," Cummings said. "I told the couple of the problem, that I would need to do further checking, and they would have to return again."

Cummings took her findings to Department of Public Safety officer Ed Longoria who, in turn contacted Lovorn.

After seeking further information from Cummings, examine the vehicle in ques-Hansford County Sheriffs Department,

Spearman Department and the Texas Department of Public Safety, Lovorn was able to identify the vehicle as one stolen in the Dallas area.

"Officer Longoria, Police Chief Jarrett Wilde, and Deputy Pete Ochoa were very helpful in the investigation, commented Lovorn, "especially with taking statements.'

According to Bob Davis, Hansford County Justice of the Peace, Lovorn was then able to trace the stolen vehicle through his conversation with the Spearman couple who had purchased one of the vehicles, to the employee of a Dallas car business who brought vehicles into the Spearman area to sell. Using this lead, Lovorn tracked down the two other stolen vehicles in Spearman and the one in Adams, Oklahoma.

The stolen vehicles confiscated in Spearman included two 1987 Chevrolet pickup trucks and a 1990 Chevrolet pickup truck. The vehicles were stolen from Plano, Arlington, and Dallas, according to Davis.



#### Diabetes Mellitus

Many people have diabetes and do not know it. Approximately 2% of Caucasians 4% of Blacks, and 6% of Hispanics have diabetes. Overweight people in general and those with strong family history of the disease are at risk. The American Diabetic Association tells us that a fasting glucose of the condition. Some of the common symptoms of undiagnosed diabetes are excessive thirst, frequent urination, weight loss in spite of good appetite, blurred vision and fatigue. If medication is required to achieve good control there are numerous oral medications available that are far superior to those that were prescribed in the past. Insulin by injection may also be needed to achieve best results. Your provider can help decide the best course of action for you and teach you how to help yourself and provide follow up management.

There is no cure for diabetes. However, with good control, most
