Gone With The Wind

Tornado Destroys Elevator

In a replay of April 10, 2001, when twin tornadoes hit the AGCO A Elevator, five miles south of Spearman on FM 760, a storm Thursday evening, June 5 devastated the AGCO Buzzard Elevator. Buzzard Elevator is located just over a mile south of the AGCO A Elevator.

Two possible funnel clouds were observed in the storm at approximately 5:00 p.m. as employees of the elevator were leaving for the

"As I left the elevator to come home, I saw two clouds that looked like funnels, but no turbulence was predicted, and I didn't think too much about it," said Randy Coombs, assistant manager of the AGCO facility.

While AGCO was able to rebuild following the 2001 storm which leveled all but two bins of the elevator, Coombs states that operations are now underway to salvage steel and grain from the area before demolition prepares the way for a new facility to be

"We had about 500,000 bushels of grain in the elevator. They are trying to salvage whatever they can," Coombs said.

"For the first two days after the storm, I just walked around in disbelief. I couldn't believe my elevator was gone.

Ashley and Caleb Patterson, who live northwest of AGCO, were working outside their home only moments before the storm hit.

"When I came into the house, the electricity was already off," Patterson said. Only moments later, Caleb said he could hear something loud.

Loading themselves and their three children, Hannah, 6, Lilly, 3, and Chaz, 6 months. in their pickup, the family attempted to flee the

"Trees were flying by our heads," Patterson said. "As we were trying to drive away, our pickup was thrown to the right side of the ditch

"My husband asked 'What should I do?' and I answered, 'Just keep going, "Patterson said.

Moments later the Patterson pickup was thrown to the ditch on the left side of the road, and then into Carl Archer's field.

"I didn't see a tornado (at that point) because we were too afraid to look up. We thought the windshield was going to burst. We just stayed on the floor board until it was all over, "Patterson said.

Extensive damage to electrical lines in eastern Hansford County was reported by Bill Carson, North

Plains Electric Coop Manager. "We had 80 poles felled by the storm in Hansford County, 40 transmission poles and 40 distributor poles," Carson said.

Power to all homes in the region was restored by Friday while work continued on restoring power to irrigation sprinklers and irrigation

While no dollar value has been established on agricultural losses sustained in the storm, Hansford County Extension Agent Burt Williams believes the losses will be great.

Wheat, nearing maturity and young corn and milo were damaged by not only the hail of the June 5th storm but also by the storm which dropped hail up to half-dollar in diameter on June 9th.

According to Bob Davis, Hansford County Justice of the Peace, there have been reports of at least 17 irrigation sprinklers toppled by the June 5th storm.

At Palo Duro Feed Yard south of Gruver, 7,000-8,000 head of cattle became mixed as a result of the storm when animals seeking to escape the hail bolted through gates and pens.

"We also had about 400-500 cattle on the highway," said Sawyer Johnson, Palo Duro Feed yard

Estimates of 4 - 5 inches of hail were reported at the facility

Millers Named Heritage Days Royalty



Sybil and Billy Miller 2003 Heritage Days Queen and King

Billy and Sybil Miller, Hansford County natives who not only recorded a portion of Hansford County history through their newspaper, but became a part of that history, have been named Heritage Days King and Queen.

The W. J. Miller family came to Spearman in 1932 from Pilot Point, Texas. Mr. Miller worked for the Nunn-Warren Corporation for 13 years before becoming owner of the Spearman Reporter. Because that was the time of the Great Depression years, each member of the Miller family regardless of his occupation had to pull together in the new enter-

Surviving the Great Depression, the Miller family soon faced a new peril, World War II. W. J. Miller, who had served in

World War I, went back in the army as captain and spent his tenure of service in Minnesota. His son W.M (Billy) Miller joined the US Marines and served in the Pacific His daughter area. Elizabeth Ann volunteered for the WAVES and was stationed in Philadelphia.

With three members of the Miller family in various branches of the service, it was imperative that new personnel were found to keep the news-

paper going.
Filling that need was
Mrs. J.H. (Mary Jane) Buchanan (the mother of Helen Fisher) who had gained newspaper experience with her husband when the Hansford Headlight was the newspaper in Old Hansford. Thompson, also versed in the newspaper business, was a part of the operation. A young lady, Sybil Martin, who

had been trained by Mr. Miller as a linotype operator became a part of the operation as did Harold Reed, a young high school student, and J. D. Wilbanks, also familiar with linotype. Eddie Faye (Hulme)

Miller, when not keeping her family posted, also did her part in the precomputer age when electypewriters were considered "gadgets."

When the war finally ended, the Miller family returned home and resumed their newspaper duties. Billy, who knew a golden opportunity when he saw it, married Miss Martin, the linotype operator in 1946.

Following the death of W. J. Miller, and some years later, his wife Eddie Faye, the Spearman Reporter was left in the hands of the young Billy and Sybil.

As editor and publisher, Billy converted from the out dated hot metal to the newer offset method of printing and soon purchased the Hansford Plainsman and the Gruver Statesman, making three weekly publications for the family. Eventually, all three newspapers were merged to form the Hansford Reporter County Statesman. After over 30 years of newspaper service, the Millers sold the Reporter Statesman to Gary and Catherine

The Millers are longtime members of the Baptist Church. Sybil was a Sunday school teacher for many years. Billy was active both in Chamber Commerce and the Lions Club, and is credited now as being the oldest mem-

ber of the latter. Sybil (Martin) Miller is a true blood Hansford County native, descending from a third generation of pioneers who settled and did their part in helping mold Hansford

now deceased, were Roy and Mareta (Carrell) Martin. Not long after graduating Spearman High School, Sybil went to work at the Spearman Reporter, a career that lasted almost 30 years

After graduating from SHS, Billy Miller attended North Texas State University for a year. He then enlisted in the Marine Corp and after basic training, was sent to Texas A&M to be trained in radio communications. He was then transported to the Pacific War Zone for a whirlwind tour of the Marshall, Gilbert, Mariana, Solomon, and Samoa Islands. He was on the way to the Invasion of Japan when the atomic bomb ended the war. Like all veterans, there are many experiences that haven't been

told. Billy now stays busy with yard work when he is not pursuing his great love of watching the Spearman Lynx and Lynxettes. Sybil has enjoyed tole painting for many years. The Millers have a most restful yard with shade and fruit trees that Billy cares for. There is an assortment of squirrels, birds and two big dogs and a Siamese cat which wanders through the yard.

Visitors are invited to come to the Zulu Museum building June 14 and see a small part of Sybil's extensive toll painting. Billy's knives from his days as a Marine will also be displayed.

The Stationmaster's House Museum and Hansford County Historical Commission are honored to have these two citizens to represent Hansford County Pioneer Heritage King and Queen.



Child safety seats are 71% effective in preventing fatalities and 67% effective in preventing serious injuries if used correctly. Instructions will be given on how to choose the right safety seat for your child, how to properly secure your safety seat in your vehicle, how to properly secure your child in their safety seat, understanding the dangers of airbags, when to turn your baby's car seat around to face forward and how to graduate your child to a booster seat. Safety seats will be checked to see if they move when you stop or turn, if they seem to small or too big for your child, if they allow your child to get out, or if they just don't fit right. They will also notify parents if their child's car seat has been recalled.

defensive starter for the S.A.G.U. Lions. Kirby was a member of the First Assembly of God, Spearman, Texas


The most important things to Kirby were living for Jesus, family, being with Amberlie and football.

Severe weather on June 5, 2003 resulted in 68 broken poles, downed lines, and power outages for residents in Hansford County. Most service was restored by Friday Morning.

High winds and stormy conditions resulted in power outages in the service area of North Plains Electric Cooperative (NPEC). NPEC began to have problems

Thursday evening at 5:00 as a strong thunderstorm moved across Hansford County. Damage was extensive ranging from Palo Duro Feedvard in the eastern part of the county to southeast of the intersection of FM 760 and highway 281 in the eastern part of the county. Overall 897 meters lost power as a result of the damage.

Twenty eight large 60-65 foot

69,000 volts of power to local substations were demolished, many broken into multiple pieces. Forty distribution poles were also destroyed. Power to three different substations was lost.

Despite the severity of the damage and working on extremely muddy roads and fields, most service was restored late Thursday night or early Friday morning. The muddy conditions slowed efforts, requiring the use of a bulldozer, as crews worked through the night on Thursday. Over Five hundred services were restored in the Gruver Southeastern Hansford County. areas by 8:30 pm Thursday evening, less than 4 hours after the storm hit.. Meters south of Spearman were not restored until Friday morning around 7 am.

"We had damage to the trans-mission line on both sides of the (Harbour) substation," said Lewis Crain, NPEC Engineer and Operations Manager. Lines were damaged on Highway 51 south of Spearman and on County Road 14 outhwest of town. "We were not able to reach the station...the damage occurred in such a way that we were not able to move power to the Harbour substation," (located at

the corner of Highways 207 and 51) he added. Ordinarily, crews can redirect power from one of two transmission lines capable of supplying power to a substation. Consequently, power was rerouted from a substation north of Spearman via undamaged distribution lines. This reroute powered up most meters south of Spearman and in the Holt community.

Because of the extensive damage to the transmission lines, a specialized construction crew from Dodge City, Kansas was contracted to begin work Friday morning. Restoration of the lines was complete by Monday at 12:00 noon. According to Operations Superintendent Chris Mendenhall, "The construction portion of the job was hampered by the debris removal that had to occur before repair could progress.

Damage to some lines feeding individual houses and one business also had to be completely rebuild and power at these locations was restored on Friday evening. Some irrigation, oil wells, and sprinklers may not be restored until early this

If your power has not been restored, please contact NPEC immediately at (806) 435-5482 Or 1-800-272-5482.

According to General Manager Randy Mahannah, "NPEC is currently working with the Texas Department of Public Safety, Governor's Division of Emergency

Management; and Hansford County Judge Jim Brown to seek disaster designation.

If you see downed power lines: DO NOT APPROACH OR TOUCH THEM and DO NOT TRY TO MOVE THEM. Contact NPEC, your local Fire, or Sheriff's Department immediately.

Storm Damage Noted

A fast-moving storm which left a swath of damage rambled through Hansford County Thursday afternoon. An official two inches of rain was recorded by Gruver City Hall in the downpour on Thursday, June 5th. A hail storm which dumped up to five inches of hail in neighboring

Sherman County and had to be cleared with snow plows from Highway 15, also hit southwest and southern parts of Hansford County. Slayton Johnson, manager of Palo Duro Feed Yard reported that hai

ccumulations were near five inches in depth. Although no livestock were lost in the storm, Johnson stated that the feed yard had 7,000-8,000 head of cattle mixed when the animals

knocked down gates and fences in an attempt to escape the hail.

At one time, 4,000-5,000 head of cattle were on the highway near the Palo Duro Feed Yard and had to be rounded up and sorted.

The storm damaged hundreds of acres of mature wheat just days away rom harvest as well as hundreds of acres of young corn and milo.

The same storm is responsible for the tornado which damaged Agoo roperties south of Spearman.

Other rainfall reported by City Hall included .01 inch on June 2, .30 on June 3, .40 on June 4, and .42 on June 9.



Hansford County Hospital Named Quality Respiratory Care Provider

Hansford County Hospital has been named a quality respiratory care provider under a new program aimed at making sure patients have access to respiratory care services provided by qualified respiratory therapists.

The American Association for Respiratory Care (AARC) started the Quality Respiratory Care Recognition (QRCR) program earlier this year to help consumers make informed choices about their health care. Hospitals recognized under the program ensure patient safety by agreeing to adhere to a strict set of criteria governing their respiratory care services.

To qualify for the recognition, Hansford County Hospital met the following conditions:

* All respiratory therapists employed by the hospital to deliver bedside respiratory care services are either legally recognized by the state as competent to provide respiratory care services or hold the

department for a little over a year.

CRT or RRT credential. Respiratory therapists are available 24 hours

* Other personnel qualified to perform specific respiratory procedures and the amount of supervision required for personnel to carry out specific procedures must be designated in writing.

* A doctor of medicine or osteopathy is designated as medical director of respiratory care

The AARC's QRCR program grew out of growing concerns among health care leaders and the general public regarding the safety and quality of health care services provided to patients. Hospitals that meet the QRCR requirements provide a level of respiratory care consistent with national standards and guidelines, and should be commended for their commitment

to quality care. Respiratory therapists are spe-cially trained health care profes-

sionals who work under physician's orders to provide a wide range of breathing treatments and other services to people with asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, cystic fibrosis, lung cancer, AIDS, and other lung or lungrelated conditions. They also care for premature infants and are key members of lifesaving response teams charged with handling med-

ical emergencies.
The AARC is a membership organization representing more than 30,000 health professionals involved in respiratory care nationwide.





Cooking with Grandma years ago is bringing sweet rewards for Melanie Elliott whose peanut brittle has been selected for distribution and sale by a Dallas gift mar-

"The candy being picked up by market has come in an unusual way," Elliott said. "Barbara Betts of Amarillo provides candles and cappuccino mixes for my store, and I, in turn, furnish my candy for her store.

"Recently the owner of Gift Pro was at a baby shower where a delicious-smelling candle caught her attention. When she tracked down the candle's origin to Betts in Amarillo, the Dallas store owner was asked by Betts if she would also be interested in cappuccino mix and candy also," Elliott said.

As a result of that inquiry, Elliott's pecan, almond coconut, and peanut brittle known as Old

Homemade Peanut Brittle will soon be on display and ready for distribution by the Dallas store.

The recipe for the candy traces back to Elliott's grandmother.

"When I was in junior high, I began to help my grandmother make the candy at Christmas time," Elliott said.

"In recent years, I have made the candy for gifts, and several have suggested that I make the candy to sell," she adds. The uniqueness of my brittle is

the light texture," Elliott said. But the method Elliott uses to achieve the special texture is her trade secret.

The company which distributes to stores in the five states - Texas, Mexico, Oklahoma, New Arkansas, and Louisiana has asked Elliott to provide an initial shipment of thirty bags of each of the three varieties of the candy by June 6th or 7th.

The Biti pie and cake business gets even sweeter with plans to expand to Borger, Canadian, Stratford, and Miami.

While it is hard for some to pick their favorite of Huffakers' repertoire, Coconut Cream leads in orders for the pies while German Chocolate and Italian Cream top the cake request list.

"While the pie fillings are to die for, the meringue is probably the

most special part of Biti "pies," Huffaker said."People really enjoy how the meringue stands up.

With Biti pies now becoming Biti Pies, Inc., the managing of Panhandle Deli and Diner has now been assumed by Huffakers'

daughter Toi Key.

"We will be serving the same menu with a special everyday,"
Key said. "We will be adding some items to our summer menu including our famous tuna salad plate and our wraps.
