



## **Crude Oil Rises Above \$100**

Minneapolis, MN (Nov. 17)- Yesterday WTI crude oil closed at \$102.59 per barrel. It's the first time ever that oil has closed above \$100 per barrel in November. And gas prices are going down?

Yes, they are. Today's national average price of gasoline (\$3.41 per gallon) is notably less than the average price at the pump the last time crude oil traded in the \$100-range. It wasn't long ago. From February through March WTI crude on the New York Mercantile Exchange (NYMEX) traded at the \$100+ per barrel level and the retail price of gasoline climbed steadily from \$3.50 to \$3.90 per gallon during the same period.

What gives?

"Nobody wants to jinx the downward trend by actually asking the question, but everybody is wondering the same thing: Why are gas prices going down instead of up?" Laskoski said."The answer, we believe, lies in the current disconnect between crude and pump prices. The two usually move in tandem, but this is one of those instances where the exception to the rule occurs, and when that happens, consumers notice immediately," said Laskoski. "WTI is now yielding to the pressure exerted by the increasing importance of Brent crude and the fact that Brent is a more accurate reflection of global value. As a result, WTI's price is rising to close that gap," he added. At the same time, both refinery utilization and total gasoline production have increased according to the most recent data from the Dept. of Energy. Additionally gasoline futures are at their lowest level since February 2011 and that facilitates the seasonal decline for wholesale and retail prices.

# Weekly Update Texas, November 21- Average retail gasoline prices

in Texas have fallen 7.3 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.14/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 5.7 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.36/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

100 Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 48.7 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 15.3 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 11.1 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 49.3 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"Gasoline prices have continued their slow decline in the last week across a solid majority of the United States, with the national average sagging to its lowest level since this past February," according to GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Many motorists may be giving thanks for the lower gasoline prices- until they realize that average prices will still easily exceed prior Thanksgiving Day records," he adds DeHaan also shared recent results from a poll conducted of its members, showing the smallest growth in holiday driving distance since it began surveying users in 2009 The poll also showed a 2% rise in the number of North Americans that would not drive at all for the holiday gathering. "This certainly isn't a shock given the higher gasoline costs, but goes to show that few motorists reduce their holiday driving because of higher prices," De-Haan states.



# Words from Faith & Grace

#### by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister

Advent (lat. coming) begins our new church year During the season of Advent we look back to the first advent of Christ as we prepare to celebrate his birth and we look forward to Christ's return in glory, his Second Advent (Greek parousia). We study Isaiah 64: 1-9, Psalm 80: 1-7,17-19, 1 Corinthians 1; 3-9, and Mark 13: 24-37.

Isaiah describes God as a mighty warrior leaving his tent. He describes the people's rejection of God and he asks God to be present again with his people. Isaiah reaffirms the relationship of God with his people. He ends his plea describing God as Artisan/Creator, "Yet, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand." Even though we may be naughty children and imperfect vessels; yet, God is our Father, God is our creator; we pray for his steadfast love and redeeming grace.

The Psalmist sings a prayer for deliverance. The refrain is found in verses 3, 7, and 19. The theme of the refrain is Restore, Shine, and Save. In the first refrain, "Restore" is a plea to God to renew a right relationship with him; "Shine" is a plea for God's presence with hi people; and "Save" is a plea to redeem Israel from her enemies. God is addressed as "O God"; in the second refrain, God is addressed as "O God of Hosts"; and in the third refrain, God is addressed as "O Lord God of Hosts". Each refrain becomes a little more 'personal' with God.

Paul emphasizes God's grace through Christ to the Corinthians and reminds the Corinthians that the spiritual gifts which they prize so highly come from God and are not a result of the Corinthians' own merit. The focus for Christians should be on God not on ourselves. Even though a believer may possess gifts of the Spirit, even so that believer is still waiting for Christ's return. Spiritual gifts are given to enable us to wait for Christ's return in a positive manner by helping others.

Toward the middle of Mark's passion narrative, Jesus addresses Peter, James, John and Andrew about the signs of the return of Christ and a prophecy about the temple at Jerusalem. The portion of the narrative describing when the destruction of the temple was to occur, "Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place." Historically, this did occur during the generation of the disciples. Despite the attempts by various evangelists to predict Christ's coming, Jesus states that only the Father knows the day and the hour of his Second Advent. There will be wars and various tribulations; it will seem that the powers of the very heavens will be shaken. Yet, Jesus assures us that though all else pass away, His words remain. The point, dear Christian, is not for us to know 'when' Christ is coming, but to be prepared for that coming! Keep awake!

It has been six years since this photo of Luis Mendoza was taken at Guymon, OK. It was his first cross country race, and he hasn't stopped running since.


In those six years Luis has recorded many wins and logged hundreds perhaps even thousands of miles. He has either been on regional qualifying teams or qualified individually all four years.




