Locally they support the Spearman and Gruver Fire Departments, The Stationmaster's House Museum, the Church of Christ Children's Home, the Hansford Hospice, the Golden Spread Senior Center and the empty stocking fund for Hansford Manor. They buy ads for the Spearman, Gruver, & Pringle-Morse yearbooks and for the area football and basketball books.



Ask Dr. Dobson

QUESTION: I keep hearing that it is unwise to get too carried away with the successes of your kids, but I can't help it.

Is it wrong for me to feel a sense of fatherly pride when my son succeeds in basketball? How can I not care about the quality of his performance?

DR DOBSON: There's nothing wrong about feeling good about the successes of our children. The problem occurs when parents care too much about those triumphs

. . when-winning is necessary to maintain their parents' respect and love.

Boys and girls should know they are accepted simply because they were created. That's enough.

I'm reminded of John McKay, the former football coach from the University of Southern California and a former National Football League coach. I saw him interviewed on television at a time when his son, John Ir., was a successful football player on the USC team.

The interviewer referred to John's ataletic talent and asked Coach McKay to comment on the pride he must feel over his son's accomplishments on the field. His answer was most impressive:

"Yes, I'm pleased that John had a good season last year. He does a fine job, and I am proud of him. But I would be just as proud of him if he had never played the game at all.

Coach McKay was saying, in effect, that John's football talent is recognized and appreciated, but his human worth does not depend on his athletic ability to play football. Thus, his son would not lose respect if the next season brought failure and disappointment.

John's place in his dad's heart was secure, being independent of his performance. I wish every child could say the same.


Parsons Attended OPSU Orientation







Extension News

by Peggy Winegarner, County Extension Agent

A typical child watches four hours of TV a day. If a child from age 2 through 12 devotes one hour of that time to watching informational and educational programs it would add 2,860 hours of useful learning or equivalent time of two years spent in school.

The goal of local FCE clubs, as well as FCE clubs state and nationwide, is for children to watch "better" not "more" TV.

By high school age, many children have spent more hours in front of the TV than in the classroom. It has been estimated that during the school years, children will witness up to 87,000 acts of violence on TV. Uncontrolled TV viewing by children can be linked to increased violent and aggressive behavior, obesity and poor academic results.

Whenever possible, watch TV with your child and question the use of violence. Talking together as a family about TV programs and advertisements can provide opportunities to discuss your values.

Television is the third educational institution -- after school and home. For this reason, FCE clubs are encouraging parents to enforce a "first hour rule". The first hour of viewing must be positive and high quality. Reading the TV guide can help you choose suitable programs. Find programs that educate, inform, enlighten or inspire.




