## Officials Warn West Nile Virus is Back

start showing up, said a Texas Cooperative Extension specialist. Dr. Greta Schuster, an Extension integrated pest management spe-
cialist in Canyon, will be dragging out her carbon dioxide light traps his week to determine how many positive mosquitoes can be found
