special meeting of the Spearman City Council. On the meeting agenda
was a status report given by Tom

Hopping, chief executive officer of
Missing Cable.
Hopping, unable to attend the
meeting in person, telephoned for a
conference call with the council. Ac-
cording to minutes of the meeting,
Hopping advised the council that his
definition of "rebuild" was different
from the council's and stated that the
company would not perform a total
rebuild on the system. The minutes
say that Hopping told the council
some of the syster's equipment
needs replacement; but some of the
lines are in good condition.
The council disagreed, and Hopp-
ing requested time to review the
company's original plans. According
to the minutes, he was sto have con-
