Informal Review

You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB memARe outside or the hearing. The law requires they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it

Review by the District Court
After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition withtn 45 days of the date you
