Weekly Update

Texas, October 15 - Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 0.9 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.51/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 2.8 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.77/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 24.3 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 13.0 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 9.0 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 29.6 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"The national average has again seen a decrease in the last week, as California joins much of the rest of the United States in seeing lower prices," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Even though there hasn't been a massive decline in California retail prices, the fact that prices have stopped rising there has helped tip the national average lower. In the week ahead, we could continue to see declines as wholesale prices fell lower late last week, meaning gas stations have additional room to drop their prices," DeHaan said.

GasBuddy operates, TexasGasPrices.com, and over 225 other local gasoline pricetracking websites that follow prices at over 125,000 gasoline stations in the United States and Canada. GasBuddy also uses Facebook (facebook.com/gasbuddy) Twitter (twitter.com/gasbuddy), and phone apps to keep motorists ahead of changing gasoline prices.

HISTORICAL MUSINGS

In a reproduction of an early Higgins newspaper (date unknown) there is a column entitled "Moral and Religious Growth and Development." In the column is the development of W.C.T.U. in Higgins. It was organized by Mrs. Zahner, state organizer in the spring of 1907, with Mrs. Frank Patton as president and a membership of "some twenty of the most loyal ladies of the town."

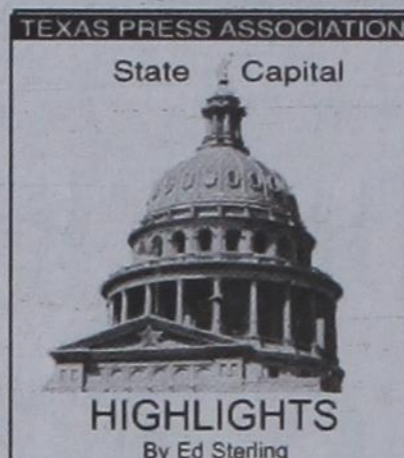
During the first few months, the efforts of the union was in the direction of charity and securing new members. During the winter of 1907-08, with Mrs. A.M. Winsegar as president, the union inaugurated and waged a successful campaign, which resulted in closing the saloons and placing Lipscomb county in the dry column. The goal of the group was to make Texas dry by 1909. State motto was "Every Union a New Union. Every Member a New Member."

The group was partially successful and their efforts are still evident through Texas with our "dry" county still present.

House panel to review what state does with revenue

AUSTIN — Money paid in state taxes and fees doesn't necessarily fund exactly what Texans think it will fund.

So, Texas House Speaker Joe Straus last week appointed an Interim Committee on General Revenue Dedicated Accounts as part of an effort, he said, "to make our state budget more transparent and accountable to taxpayers." The committee will report its findings and recommendations to the House in early January.

Straus explained that for more than 20 years, the state has allowed money that sits in general revenue-dedicated funds — nearly \$5 billion in the current fiscal biennium — to be used to certify the rest of the state budget.

"The practice of 'funds consolidation' has evolved from a one-time accommodation and turned into a decades-long bad habit in our state's budget process, and now is the time to move toward a fairer, simpler and more straightforward approach for Texas taxpayers," Straus said Oct. 9.

State Reps. Drew Darby, R-San Angelo, and John Otto, R-Dayton will co-chair the committee. Darby said the state "should provide the services people and businesses expect on those taxes and fees dedicated for a specific purpose. Truth in taxation also requires that we bring these revenues in line with fiscally responsible appropriations."

Straus also appointed to the committee state Reps. Rafael Anchia, D-Dallas; Larry Gonzales, R-Round Rock; Patricia Harless, R-Spring; Donna Howard, D-Austin; Jose Mendez, D-San Antonio; Jim Pitts, R-Waxahachie; and Sylvester Turner, D-Houston.

Sales tax revenue grows

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced Oct. 10 that state sales tax revenue in September was \$1.96 billion, up 11.6 percent compared to September 2011, and that state sales tax revenue has increased for the 30th month in a row.

She said continued strength in the manufacturing and oil and natural gas sectors led to the sales tax revenue increase, while collections improved thanks to consumer spending at restaurants and retail stores.

Voting 'application' de-

Secretary of State Hope Andrade on Oct. 3 announced the launch of SmartTXVoter, an English and Spanish language smartphone application "to help Texans stay informed about statewide voting information like registration deadlines, early voting dates and candidates or amendments on the upcoming ballot."

SmartTXVoter, viewable in English or Spanish, is formatted to be accessible for Texans with visual impairments. The app is part of the "Make Your Mark on Texas" program meant to educate Texans about voting pursuant to the federal Help America Vote Act.

Drought disaster continues

Gov. Rick Perry on Oct. 5 renewed — for yet another month — the emergency Disaster Proclamation he originally signed on July 5, 2011.

The proclamation certifies that exceptional drought conditions pose a threat of imminent disaster in specified counties in Texas. Some 138 of the state's 254 counties are named in the current proclamation.

Court hears Fisher case

The U.S. Supreme Court on Oct. 10 heard oral arguments in Fisher v. University of Texas, a case contesting the university's admissions policy, which allows the institution to consider an applicant's race as a factor in choosing which students to admit.

Counsel for the plaintiff maintained the policy unfairly discriminated against Abigail Fisher, a white fe-

male student from Sugar Land, who scored higher on tests and other factors than some black and Hispanic students that gained admission.

Counsel for UT defended the university's policy of "holistic individualized consideration" of each student application and asserted that race "doesn't invariably make a difference with respect to every minority applicant."

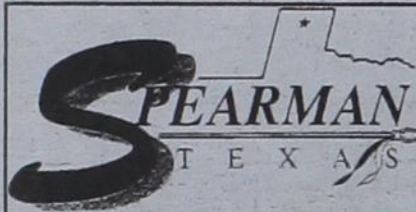
Some court watchers predict that if the court rules in favor of the plaintiff, it could spell the end of affirmative action policies now in place across the country. Others have expressed that a ruling in favor of the university is critical for continuation of efforts to promote racial and ethnic diversity.

A ruling in the case could take any length of time from a few days to many weeks, or months.

Meningitis case confirmed

The Texas Department of State Health Services on Oct. 12 announced it had linked one case of meningitis to steroid injections produced by the New England Compounding Center.

The patient, an adult female from Central Texas, was evaluated after experiencing meningitis symptoms. Symptoms of meningitis include fever, nausea, vomiting, photophobia, neck stiffness and headache. The patient was hospitalized and is being treated with antifungal drugs. Additional details about the patient are not being released to protect her identity, the state health department stated in a news release.

Words from Faith & Grace

In the twenty-first week after Pentecost, we learn of the suffering servant of God, the critical nature of our response to God, Jesus as our heavenly High Priest, and the Messiah's servant mission. We study Isaiah 52:4-12, Psalm 91: 9-16, Hebrews 5: 1-10, and Mark 10: 35-4.

Isaiah brings word to the exiles that God will redeem them and he will be known by them. The "Suffering Servant" shall be vindicated; the people shall go forth from exile (a new 'exodus') not in fear and in panic but they shall go out with dignity. For us as Christians we read Isaiah 53 and see the very image of Jesus the Christ. We listen each Christmas season to Handel's, "Messiah", and sometimes forget the connection with Handel and Psalm 53. The "Suffering Servant" who was marred in appearance and not accepted by the rulers and leaders will be the instrument of salvation.

The Psalmist sings a song of "My refuge and fortress; my God, in whom I trust." The passage we look at this week teaches us that our response to God is critical; we must entrust ourselves entirely to God and such trust in God is deliverance, salvation, and satisfaction. Verses 14 through 16 are the promises God makes: Those who love me, I will deliver; I will protect those who know my name; when they call me I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble; I will rescue them and honor them. With long life I will satisfy them and show them my salvation." The Word of God! How much suffering do we endure needlessly because we cannot bring ourselves to trust Him?

The writer of Hebrews makes his case for Jesus the Christ being our heavenly High Priest. Verses 1-4 give us the criteria for one to be a 'high priest'. Verses 5-10 explain how Jesus the Christ meets these criteria. The high priest makes sacrifices for the people, but those sacrifices only atoned for sins of ignorance, they did not atone for intentional sins that were coldly calculated in their execution. But Christ is made perfect from suffering. Christ is 'perfect' in the sense that he has carried out the purpose of his incarnation, teaching, suffering and death on a cross. Having experienced all that sin can do to a man, his resurrection by God frees us from the cross of our sins. Please read the book of Hebrews carefully and prayerfully.

Mark shows us an ambitious James and John, asking that they be allowed to sit at Christ's right hand and left hand in the kingdom. Jesus has previously healed a blind man; James and John are blind to the nature of Jesus as Messiah! Jesus discusses his "servant mission" and cryptically asks, "Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" James and John without hesitation declare that they are so able. Christ then warns, "The cup I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized." Remember that the historical tradition of the church tells us that all the apostles except John were killed in the course of their ministry. Jesus then reinforces the suffering servant theme by telling all of them that to be great they must be slave of all. "We are not called now to glory but to service.

May the Holy Spirit grant you a sense of humility and service that you may emulate the steadfast love of Jesus the Christ and truly enter the kingdom of God.

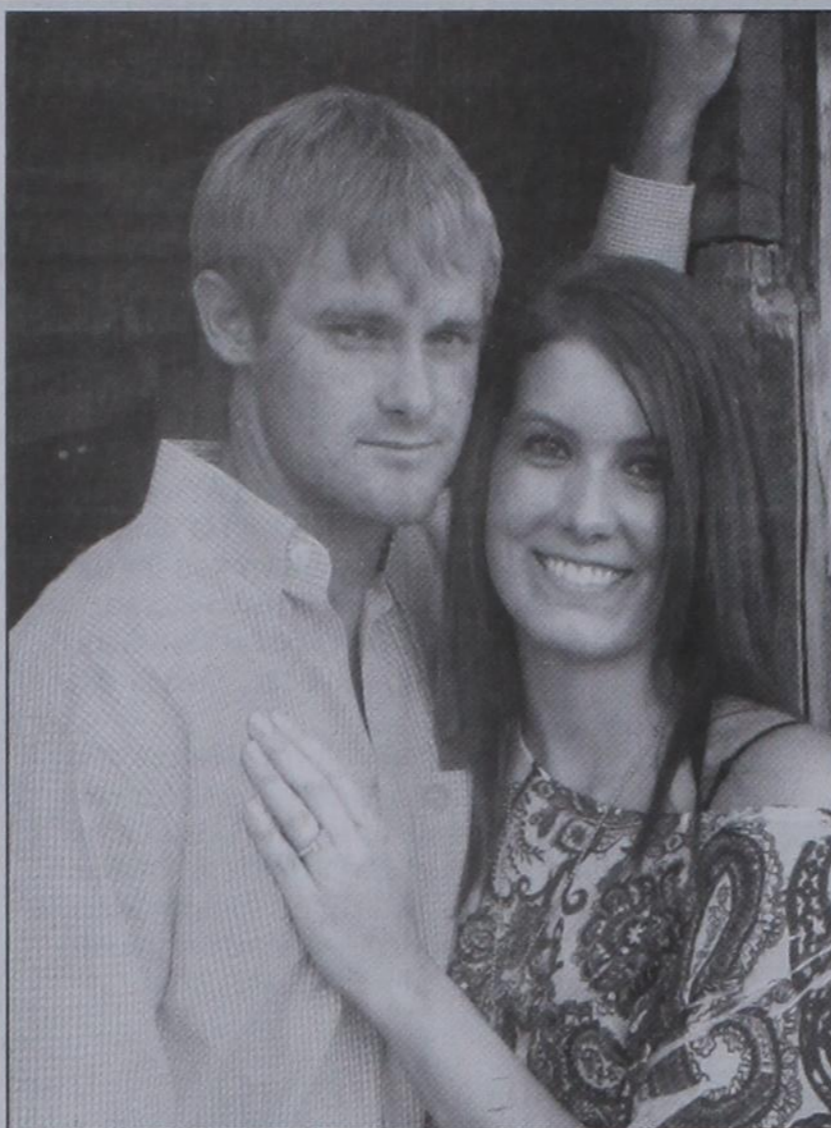

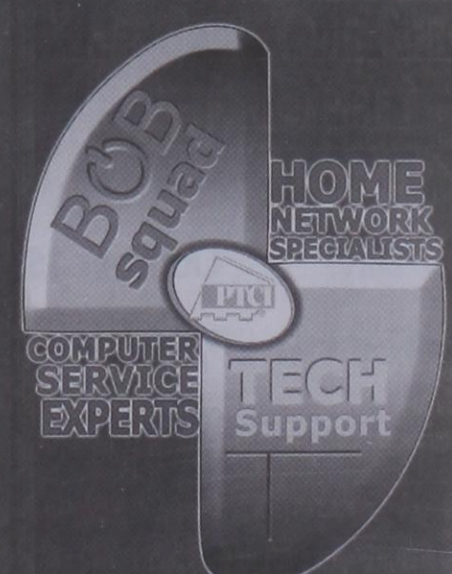

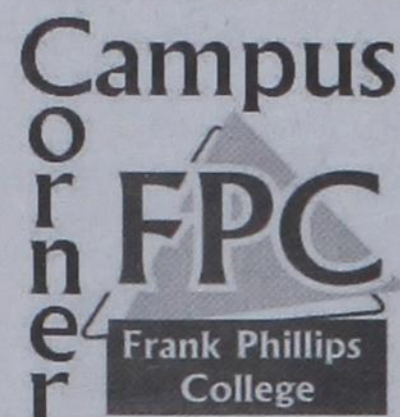

Professional Food Manager Certification Training Set Oct. 22-23 in Dumas

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service in Moore County will offer a Professional Food Manager Certification Training course Oct. 22-23 at the AgriLife Extension office for Moore County, 310 East First Street, Dumas.

The program includes training, materials and a national food manager certification examination, said Sue Owens, AgriLife Extension family and consumer sciences agent in Moore County. The food manager's certification will be valid for five years.

Under the Texas Department of State Health Services jurisdiction, each food establishment is required to have one certified food

manager on site, Owens said.

This program is designed to not only prepare foodservice managers to pass the certification examination; it will provide valuable education regarding the safe handling of food, she said.

The benefits of improved food safety include: Increased customer satisfaction, improved relationships with health officials and prevention of bad publicity and law suits due to foodborne illness, Owens said.

Foodservice managers attending the program will learn about:

- Identifying potentially hazardous foods and common errors in food han-

- Preventing contamination and cross-contamination of food.
- Teaching and encouraging personal hygiene for employees.
- Complying with government regulations.
- Maintaining clean utensils, equipment and surroundings.
- Controlling pests.

Foodborne illnesses can be prevented by following simple food safety practices, Owens said. Advanced registration is required by Oct. 19. For more information or to register for the course, call the AgriLife Extension office in Moore County, 806-935-2594.

USDA Announces Disaster Assistance Sign-up for 2011 Crop Losses

Hansford-Hutchinson County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Rick Hargrove today announced that producers can enroll in the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments (SURE) program for 2011 crop year losses beginning Oct. 22, 2012. Under the 2008 Farm Bill, SURE authorizes assistance to farmers and ranchers who suffered crop losses caused by natural disasters occurring through Sept. 30, 2011.

"Eligible producers who experienced a 2011 crop loss can contact the Hansford-Hutchinson County FSA office to learn more about the SURE program," said Hargrove. "All eligible farmers and ranchers must sign up for 2011 SURE benefits before the June 7, 2013 deadline," he said.

To qualify for a SURE payment, the producer's operation must be located in a county that was declared a disaster for 2011 and have at least a 10 percent production loss that affects one crop of economic significance. Producers with agricultural operations located outside a disaster county are eligible for SURE benefits if they had a production loss greater or equal to 50 percent of the normal production on the farm.


In Texas, 213 counties received a primary Secretarial Disaster Designation and 41 counties received a contiguous Secretarial Disaster Designation during 2011. This means that all 254 counties in Texas can apply for SURE benefits as long as all other eligibility requirements are met.

To meet program eligibility requirements, producers must have obtained a policy or plan of insurance for all insurable crops through the

Federal Crop Insurance Corporation and obtained Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) coverage on non-insurable crops, if available, from FSA. Eligible farmers and ranchers who meet the definition of a socially disadvantaged, limited resource or beginning farmer or rancher do not have to meet this requirement. Forage

crops intended for grazing are not eligible for SURE benefits.

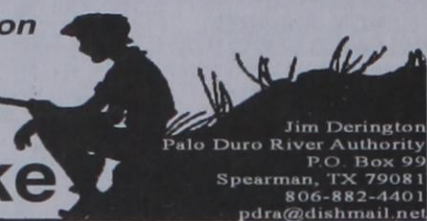

Something nice did happen, though. Russell Shaver of Spearman, a frequent visitor to the Lake, sent Jim a set of pictures he had taken. Some are of bobcats in trees, and at least one is of a Clark's Grebe. The story and picture on the rare Grebe will wait until later.

Drowning
Cleon Roberts, writer and researcher of Panhandle history, has sent another item of interest. Caple was a post office and store on Hackberry Creek not far over the line into what became Texas County, Oklahoma.

Beaver Herald, Thursday, April 12, 1899:

Samuel Caple, a young man about twenty years old living at Caple in this county, is supposed to have been drowned last Thursday. He was working over in Texas, near the head of the Palo Duro River, when on Thursday a cloudburst occurred in that vicinity, causing the river to rise very suddenly. It is thought that his horse was on the opposite side of the river from where he was at work and he had attempted to swim the river to get the animal, as his clothes were discovered across the river from the animal. Up to the last report, his body had not been found, but the general opinion is that he was drowned.

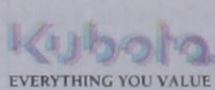
