Lynx Skin Wildcats On To Regionals

On Friday afternoon, at a Spearman school wide pep rally, Dr. Scott Martin challenged the Spearman Lynx with the question, "Are the Lynx for real?" Friday night in Canyon, this scrapping team demonstrated how real they really were.

The Lynx faced a competent, undefeated Idalou Wildcat team, but they dug deep and brought home the Area Championship trophy. Early in the third quarter, the Wildcats took the lead and appeared to begin controlling the game, but the Lynx, with the courage and determination that they have demonstrated all season rallied for the come from behind 24-14 victory. This brings the lynx season record to 11-1.

A very strong effort on the part of the Lynx defense held the Wildcats to only 106 rushing yards and caused the Idalou team to turn the ball over 5 times. Eric Cudd, Eric Varnon and Clint Goodman all made interceptions for the Lynx.

Statistically, it was a very close game with both teams having 14 first downs and 287 total yards for Spearman and 261 total yards for Idalou. Although the Wildcats had a strong passing game with 155 yards (82 yards on two plays), they were no match for the Lynx defense. Jake Howard scored first for

the Lynx with a 6 yard run. Britt Savage kicked a 27 yard field

goal. Howard scored again with a 1 yard run. Michael Witten carried the ball 28 yards for the Lynx final touchdown.

Blake Beedy and Clint Goodman were named the defensive players of the week and Michael Witten was named the offensive player of the week. Beedy had 15 assisted tackles and 3 unassisted tackles. Goodman had 5 assisted tackles and 2 unassisted tackles. Witten carried the ball 26 times for 176

Frankie Dominquez, Eric Cudd and Eric Varnon all recovered fumbles for the Lynx team.

Said Coach Ric Smith, "This Lynx team has done a great job

They have shown a lot of heart and there is no quit in them."

Concerning the regional game, Smith commented,"The game against Iraan is going to be a tough one. They are similar to Idalou. They throw the ball more than Idalou and we are going to have to be able to stop both the running and passing game."

This victory takes the Lynx to the regional playoffs. The game is scheduled for 7:30, Friday night at Lowry Field in Lubbock against Iraan.

Spearman Elementary Honored

recently honored with a four star affiliate of the Greater Houston rating in the November issue of the Texas Monthly magazine.

3,172 elementary schools in Texas. The rating system was based on the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) test, the one consistent, uniform statewide measure of what students are learning. Several hundred schools were excluded from the ratings because they tested fewer than fifty students or contained only one or two grades and thus did not meet the Texas Education test. Agency's definition of an alone do not tell much about how good a job a school is doing. To compare a suburban school with an inner-city school, even in the same area, is to compare apples and oranges. A good rating system has to compare a school with others whose students have similar characteristics.



- · A second star if the school elementary school. TAAS Scores ranked at or above the median passing rate on the TAAS test for schools with a similar percentage of disadvantaged students.

Nursery (WTN) has grown windbreak seedlings, evergreen and deciduous trees and shrubs, for landowners from the coast of Corpus Christi to Texline in the

objective is to produce and sell quality seedlings at a price that landowners can afford, enabling them to plant large quantities of trees to establish multiple row windbreaks.

Windbreaks are trees and shrubs systematically planted adjacent to fields, homesteads, or feedlots as a barrier to reduce or redirect the wind. They create permanent, natural protection and habitat for wildlife, reduce erosion and increase permanent, natural protection and habitat for wildlife, reduce erosion and increase land value and aesthetics.

Annually, WTN grows approximately 200,000 evergreens of eight different species in its two irrigated greenhouses and about 400,000 bare-root seedlings in its eight-acre field nursery. The trees are grown from seed collected by nursery staff.

Each year the seedlings are sold and delivered through Hansford Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) and over 90 other SWCSs around the state. The date of delivery, beginning in February, is dependent on the planting season within the delivery region.


But the WTN's service does not halt at production. Nursery staff members also assist High Plains producers by taking conservation from the greenhouse to the field. Upon the request of a High Plains landowner, the TFS WTN will meet with the landowner, discuss the protection needs and design a windbreak plan according to those needs. Landowners willing to follow the guidelines listed within their plan are then personally assisted by the TFS in planting the windbreak. (Qualifying landowners must own at least 160 acres.)

The TFS supplies a tree planter, which plants 400 to 500 seedlings per hour, and a fabric layer, rolling out a UV synthetic fabric requirements for their degrees over the seedlings. The fabric conserves moisture and reduces weeds.

The TFS assists in planting field, livestock, homestead and wildlife windbreaks and living snow fences. In 1995 the TFS assisted high Plains landowners in planting 14 miles of windbreaks.

Producers, be it the farmer or rancher, interested in windbreak protection can begin ordering seedlings this fall for the 1997 planting season through the Hansford SWCD.
