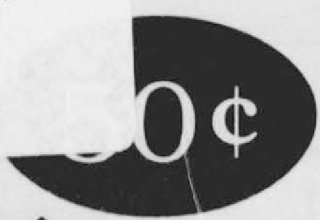

School Board Recognition

Governor George W. Bush has proclaimed January 1999 as School Board Recognition Month and districts across the state will use this opportunity to bolster understanding of the crucial role elected boards of education play in their communities and schools.

"Education is our number one priority in Texas. It is the most important thing we will ever do as a state, and we must get it right. Helping to achieve this goal are the dedicated and hard-working members of more than 1,000 local school boards across the Lone Star State," he said.

"These men and women represent the largest group of publicly elected officials in Texas. They make policy, set budgets, and oversee local schools in accordance with the will of the people. School boards work to ensure academic excellence and accountability for students, teachers, and administrators. They also confront challenges and problems that would have been unimaginable a generation ago. These include providing children with appropriate numbers of up-to-date computers as well as guaranteeing their security and well-being," Bush said.

"The Texas Association of School Boards (TASB), created in 1949, represents and serves local school boards across the Lone Star State. TASB has designated January 1999 as School Board Recognition Month to increase public awareness of the vital role these boards play, in close cooperation with parents and teachers, in ensuring a quality education for the young people of Texas," he said.

"I encourage all Texans to recognize with appreciation the dedication and diligence of school board members and to work together with teachers and local school boards to help our children achieve their highest potential," Bush said.

"School board members serve as advocates for our children first and foremost, protecting each child's opportunity to maximize his or her

potential. They offer vision, knowledge, leadership, and dedication, and work purely for the common good. It is important to recognize the many contributions made by our locally elected school board members and support them as they tackle the demanding and rewarding task of educating our children," said James B. Crow, TASB executive director.

"Local trustees work with community leaders, families, and educators to develop sound educational policies in their districts. They help us to set high standards in the education system and encourage us to strive to reach those goals. The results of this cooperative effort are reflected in a generation of Texas children who are more prepared to be our nation's leaders," he said.

"Today's schools face great challenges and great opportunities, making the school board's role more critical than ever before. We hope every community will acknowledge the thousands of trustees, and particularly their local school board members, who make the time to care about Texas children and their futures," Crow said.

School Board Recognition Month kits with certificates, camera-ready art work sample news release and proclamation, and tips for district activities were mailed in November to all superintendents and Texas School Public Relations Association members. Information is also posted on the TASB web site at www.tasb.org or call Barbara Williams, TASB public information officer, at 800-580-8272.

TASB is a nonprofit association established nearly 50 years ago to serve local Texas school districts. It includes 1,047 school districts and county school boards, 44 junior colleges, 51 tax appraisal districts, 159 cooperatives, and 20 education service centers. School board members are the largest group of publicly elected officials in the state. The districts they represent have a combined annual budget of \$20 billion and employ more than 475,000 people.

Job Training Funds Available

The Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) has funds available to help residents of Hansford, Hutchinson, Ochiltree, and Lipscomb counties receive job training.

The program can help eligible applicants with college or place them with local businesses for on-the-job training.

Businesses participating in on-the-job training will be reimbursed for part of the cost of employing new workers through a contract. Training positions must be full time and develop the skills of the person to be trained.

Vocational college in certain occupations can also be paid for by JTPA. The program targets youths through age 21 and persons 22 or older who will benefit from new or additional training. Current students as well as new ones, are encouraged to apply for financial aid. Many medical, technical, clerical and management programs are covered.

Persons who wish to apply for the program, and any interested businesses, may contact Pat Rinehart at the Texas Workforce

Center in Borger, or call (806) 274-3242.

Ms. Rinehart is in Perryton on the 1st Thursday, Spearman on the 2nd Thursday, and Lipscomb on the 3rd Thursday of each month, or anyone interested may call for an appointment if they cannot meet on those dates. Those interested in counties other than Hansford, Hutchinson, Ochiltree and

Lipscomb may contact their JTPA representative at the local Workforce Center for assistance.

JTPA is made available by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission as administrator for the Panhandle Workforce Development Partnership. Applicants must meet income guidelines or targeted group status in order to qualify.

Financial Aid Seminar

Are you financially prepared to send your child to college? Spearman High School is hosting a Financial Aid Seminar on Thursday, January 28th at 7:00 p.m. in the high school auditorium. The purpose of this seminar is to help parents explore options for paying for college costs.

Representatives from West Texas A&M University, Panhandle Plains Higher Education Authority, Region XVI, First State Bank, and First National Bank will present information to guide parents in their quest for funds to send their

child to college. Some of the topics that will be discussed at the seminar include the following: How To Apply For Financial Aid; Grants and Loans; Financial Planning; Sources of Financial Aid; and What is the FAFSA?

The seminar is open to ALL parents and students. It's never too early to plan for your child's education. There will also be a \$100 scholarship given away that night.

National Spelling Bee

The Scripps Howard National Spelling Bee is an educational promotion sponsored by the E.W. Scripps Company in conjunction with the Amarillo Daily News and in part by the Hansford County Reporter-Statesman.

The program takes place on two levels: local and national. The local program is open to students attending public or home schools in Hansford County.

Participants must have not reached their 16th birthday on or before the date of May 30, 1999 and must not have passed the eighth grade at the time of their school finals.

Eligibility for the program begins with the 4th grade competing in the junior division.

This division is not eligible for national competition.

The local competition will be held on Thursday, February 25, 1999 in Spearman and the regional competition will be held on Saturday, April 10th in the West Texas A&M University Mary Moody Northern Recital Hall.

The local winner will receive a

bicycle donated by B&B Sales Co. in Spearman. The regional winner will receive an all expense paid trip to Washington, D.C. to compete in the Scripps Howard National Spelling Bee in May.

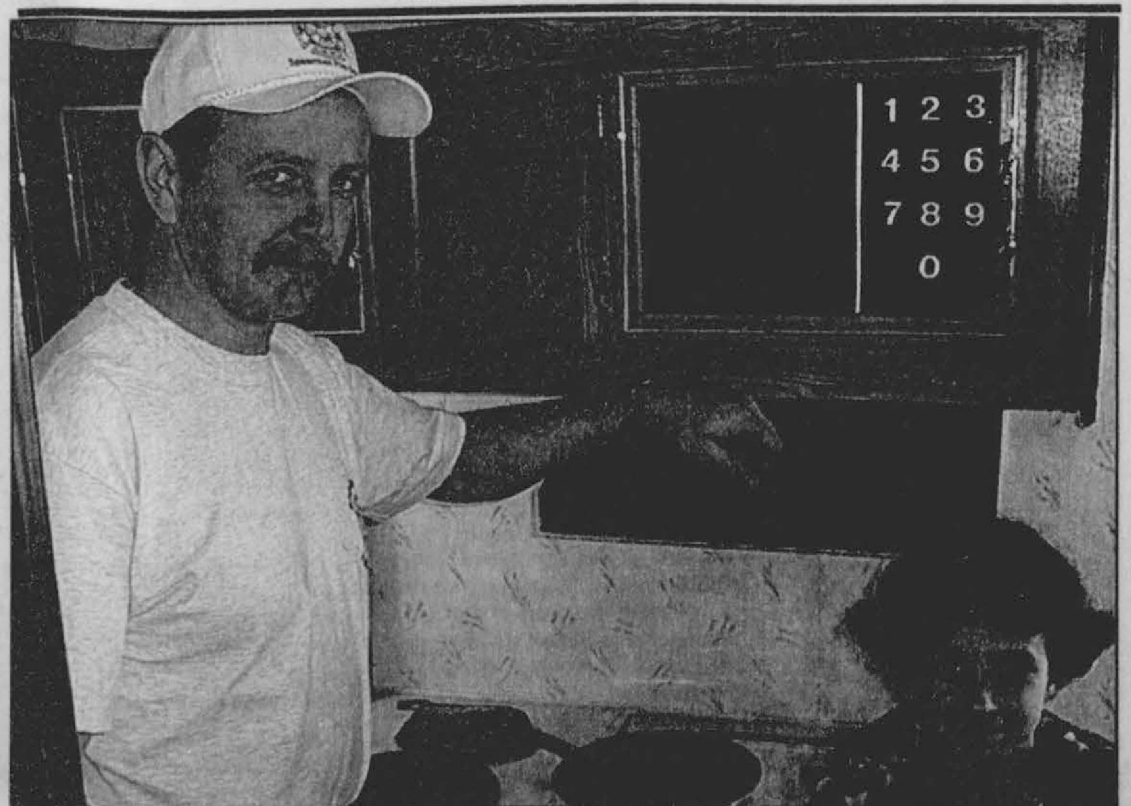

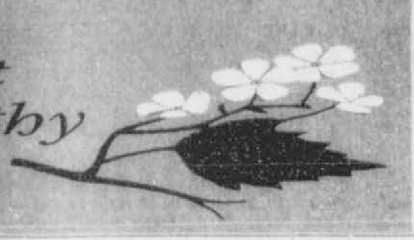

Fred Haley Tinsley Sr., 81, of Pampa, died Thursday, January 14, 1999.

Services were held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 16, 1999 in the First Christian Church in Pampa with the Rev. Darrell W. Evans, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Memory Gardens Cemetery with graveside rites by Pampa Masonic Lodge 966 AF&AM. Arrangements were by Carmichael-Whitley Funeral Directors.

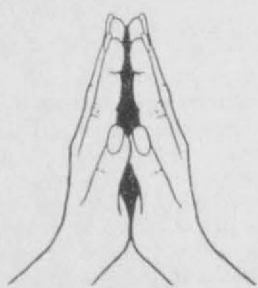

Test Dates Set

The 1999 Spring TAAS (Texas Assessment of Academic Skills) and the TEAMS (Texas Assessment of Minimum Skills) exit level tests will be given in February at Spearman High School, 403 East 11th Street, for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students as well as out-of-school students who have not passed some or all portions of those tests.

Dates for the TAAS are: Writing, February 23; Math, February 24; Reading, February 25. Dates for TEAMS are: Math, February 24, English Language Arts, February 25. Only students who are not currently enrolled in Spearman High School who still need to pass the TAAS or TEAMS to fulfill graduation requirements must preregister for the tests.
