shall remain in effect for ninety ( 90 ) days or until the state of disaster is terminated:

1. THE USE OF COMBUSTIBLE MA TERIALS IN AN OUTDOOR ENVI-
RONMENT BY ANY PERSON IS PROHIBITED.
a. Any individual gainfully employed in a trade or profession that involves the use
of combustible materials or use of possible fire sources in the outdoor environment directly related to the successful
operation of the business's goals and/or operation of the business's goals and/o
objectives may continue to conduct busipotential fire sources in the outdoor environment as they deem necessary; provided that the individual shall take all necessary
safety precautions to prevent the ignition safety precautions to prevent the ignition
of any fire or fires that are not essential to the conducting of day to day business ac-
