Someone sent me the following story about Fiorello LaGuardia. It is a very touching story and I hope you enjoy it.

## Voice of Compassion

Fiorello La Guardia was mayor of New York City during the worst days of the Great Depression and all of WWII. He was adored by many New Yorkers who took to calling fiim thie "Sittle Ftower," because he was so short and afways wore a carnation in his lapel.
He was a colorful character - he rode the New York City fire trucks, raided city "speakeasies" with the police department, took entire orpfianages to baseball games, and whien thie New York newspapers went on strike, he got on the radio and read the Sunday funnies to the kids.
One bitterly cold nigft in Ianuary of 1935, thie mayor turned up at a night court that served the poorest ward of the city. LaGuardia dismissed the judge for the evening and took over the bench himself. Witfiin a few minutes, a tattered old woman was brought before fim, charged with stealing a loaf of Gread. She told LaGuardia that fier daughter's fusband fiad deserted her, fier daugfiter was sick, and hier two grandcfild dren were starving.
But the shopkeeper, from whom the Gread was stolen, refused to drop the charges. "It's a real bad neighborfiood, your Honor," the man told the mayor. "She's got to be punished to teach othier people around here a lesson.
LaGuardia sigfied. He turned to thie woman and said, "Ive got to punish you. The law makes no exceptions. Ten dollars or ten days in jail." But even as hie pronounced sentence, the mayor was alfready reaching into fis pocket He extracted a bill and tossed it into fis famous hat, saying, "Here is the ten dofLar fine wfich I now remit; and furthermore I am going to fine everyone in this courtroom fifty cents for living in a town where a person has to steal Gread so that her grandecfilldren can eat. Mr. Bailiff, collect the fines and give them to the defendant
The following day, New York City newspapers reported that $\$ 47.50$ was turned over to a bewildered woman who had stolen a loaf of bread to feed her starving grandecfildren. Fifty cents of that amount was contributed by the grocery store owner fimself, wfile some seventy petty criminals, people with traffic violations, and New York City policemen, each paid fifty cents.
Someone beautifully said, "Sympatfy sees and says, 'ITm sorry.' Compassion sees and says, 'IIC help.' When we leam the difference, we can make a difference.

May God bless and keep you; May He make his face to stiine upon you, and be gracious to you; May the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.
