honor Union soldiers of the American honor Union soldiers of the American
Civil War. It was extended after World War I to honor Americans who have died in all wars.
Memorial Day often marks the start of Day its end.
Begun as a ritual of remembrance and reconciliation after the Civil War, by the early 20 th century, Memorial Day was an
occasion for more general expressions of occasion for more general expressions of
memory, as ordinary people visited the graves of their deceased relatives, whether they had served in the military or not. It also became a long weekend increasingly devoted to shopping, family
get-togethers, fireworks, trips to the get-togethers, fireworks, trips to the
beach, and national media events such as the Indianapolis 500 auto race, held since the Indianapolis 500 auto
1911 on Memorial Day.
