

John R. Collard, Jr., 83, died on Sunday, October 4, 1998 in Baptist St. Anthony's Hospice Unit in Amarillo.

Services will be held on Sunday, October 11, 1998 at 2:30 p.m. in the Spearman United Methodist Church with Todd Dyess officiating. Burial will be in Hansford Cemetery by Boxwell Brothers Funeral Home of Spearman.

John R. was born in Old Hansford, October 14, 1914 and was a life-long resident of Hansford County until his wife Marjorie died in 1989, when he

moved to Amarillo. He was a resident of Seville Estates when he died. John R. was a member of St. Stephen United Methodist Church in

John R. retired from 30 years of real estate, insurance, farm and ranch management.

John R. served three years in the Navy during World War II in both the Atlantic and Pacific theaters before returning to Spearman. He received an Honorable Discharge as Lieutenant Senior Grade.

While living in Spearman, Mr. Collard was active in both the Boy and Girl Scouts. He was active in the Adobe Walls Boy Scout Council for 50 years, awarded both a Silver Beaver and a Scouter's Key. John R. was also a member of the Spearman Chamber of Commerce and the Spearman Rotary Club.

Rotary was important to John R. He was a Paul Harris Fellow of Rotary International plus he served as District Governor of Texas. He attended Amarillo West Rotary after moving to Amarillo.

John R.'s first love was the Masonic Lodge. He was president of the Texas Shrine Association, 1961-62. He served as the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Texas AF&AM in 1963. He had a sincere devotion to the Craft and has visited every lodge in Texas. He was known as the "Flying Grand Master." In 1975 he made 33rd Degree Scottish Rite

John R. was active in Hansford Lodge #1040, Spearman, serving in nearly every station including Worshipful Master. Other Masonic activities included the Capitular Masonry, Cryptic Masonry, Commandry, Scottish Rite, York Rite, Shrine Khiva Temple (Potentate 1961-61), Spearman Chapter #721 Eastern Star, DeMolay, and Order of the Rainbow for Girls. John R. was involved in many degree teams. He also received several Masonic grand appointments including being a charter member of the Texas Lodge of Research. Additionally, he served for eight years on the Board of Governors for the Sheiners Crippled Children's Hospital - Galveston Burn Unit.

The motivating forces behind John R.'s life was his love for God, his family, the Masonic Order and the land and people of Hansford County.

This may be best summed up by his first message to the Craft as Grand Master when he said, "I pray that, by the grace of God, I may serve you well." And he did.

John R. was preceded in death by his wife Marjorie Davis Collard. Survivors include his three children: Thomas Collard of Allen, TX. Helen Red of Ft. Worth, TX, and Carolyne Long of Amarillo; seven grandchildren; and his sister, Harriet Ann Robb.



Focus On The Family

QUESTION: Our two children will obey my husband with just a word from him, even responding to a slight frown when we are in a group setting. But I have to scream and threaten to make them behave. Why do you suppose this is true?

DR. DOBSON: That difference in response usually

esults from these factors:

* The father is more likely to back up his commands with action if the children don't obey. Over the years, the kids have come to understand that Dad means business.

* The mother spends more time with the children, and as the old saying goes, "Familiarity breeds contempt." Her authority has gradually eroded from the constant pressure. There is another phenomenon at work, however, that I

would like you to consider in greater detail. I'm referring to the fact that children naturally look to their father for authority. For instance, when our son, Ryan, was 4 years old, he overheard a reference to my childhood. This prompted the following exchange:

"Daddy, were you ever a little boy?" he asked. "Yes, Ryan, I was smaller than you," I replied

"Were you ever a baby?" he inquired with disbelief.

"Yes. Everyone is a tiny baby when he or she is born." Ryan looked puzzled. He simply could not comprehend his 6-foot-2-inch, 190-pound father as an infant. He thought for a minute and then said, "Were you a daddy-

It was impossible for Ryan to imagine me without the mantle of authority, even if I were a tiny newborn. His 9year-old sister reacted similarly the first time she was shown home movies of me when I was only 4. There on the screen was a baby-faced, innocent lad on a horse. Danae had to be assured that the picture was of me, whereupon she exclaimed, "That kid is my father?"

Danae and Ryan both revealed their perception of me, not as a man who had been given authority, but as a man who was authority. Such is the nature of childhood. Boys and girls typically look up to their fathers, whose size and power and deeper voices bespeak leadership.

That's why, despite numerous exceptions, male teachers are likely to handle classroom discipline more easily than soft ladies with feminine voices. (A woman teacher once told me that the struggle to control her class was like trying to keep 32 Ping-Pong balls under water at the same

That is also why mothers need the disciplinary involvement of their husbands. That doesn't mean a man must handle every act of disobedience, but he should serve as the frame on which parental authority is constructed. Furthermore, it must be clear to the kids that Dad is in agreement with Mother's policies, and he will defend her in instances of insurrection
